GOSPEL: Luke 14: 25-33

None of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE GOSPEL PASSAGE, CONTINUING OUR READINGS FROM ST LUKE, speaks of the challenges of discipleship, and the fact that we need to give our 'all' to following Christ. We cannot be a half-hearted Christian; it just doesn't work like that. Our Lord speaks of "taking up our Cross every day and following Him." In particular, He tells us that we should not rely on *possessions* as the answer to a happy life. Let's really take Jesus's words to heart as we hear them this Sunday.

I CELEBRATED LAST WEEK MY 20TH ANNIVERSARY OF ORDINATION TO THE PRIESTHOOD, and I look forward to a further marking of that occasion with the 11.15 Mass this Sunday and the Parish Barbecue for 180 parishioners to follow. PRAYER & LITURGY

"COME AND SEE" – we are going to be running a course through the autumn, starting late September, which is open to all parishioners – and also to non-parishioners, especially those adults thinking of seeking Baptism or the other Sacraments of the Catholic Church.* This course, using very good video materials produced by a priest of this diocese, will enable all those attending to think through their faith, the reasons for their belief and their further commitment to Our Lord Jesus Christ. (* This would include also those Catholic adults who have never been prepared to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.)

DATES FOR THIS PROGRAMME: starts Monday 23rd Sept, 7.30–9pm. Following dates: 30th Sept; 7th, 14th, 21st & 28th Oct; 18th & 25th Nov; 2nd & 9th Dec.

CONFIRMATION 2020: an initial meeting for the coming year's programme is likely to be **Tuesday 1st October.** Forms available to apply for the course next weekend.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION COURSE: application forms for children in Yrs 3+ are now available to collect from Fr Philip after all Masses this weekend (and not available from the presbytery). Please return the forms to the presbytery a.s.a.p. (and at least by the end of September) so we know how many children to order books for. The sign-in sheet for attendance at Mass will commence immediately (from Sunday 15th Sept.) because the children asking for these sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion need to be coming to Mass weekly. (At 9.15am Mass they can attend the Children's Liturgy of the Word.)

The first meeting for parents will be on **Wednesday 27th November at 8pm** in the crypt. N.B. The classes for the children will be held on **Sat 18th Jan, 10–3pm; Sat 15th Feb 10–3pm; Sat 16th May 10–3pm; Sat 6th June 10–2pm; and Sat 13th June 10–11am.** The first confessions will be held on Mon/Tues 2nd or 3rd March 5–6pm. The First Holy Communion Masses will be on 21st or 28th June at 1.30pm. Please review all the above dates and if you are unable to commit to all the dates, please defer applying for the course until next year. Dates for further parents' meetings will follow in due course.

FEAST OF THE WEEK

THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS 14TH SEPTEMBER

This feast was observed in Rome before the end of the seventh century. It commemorates the recovery of the Holy Cross, which had been placed on Mt. Calvary by St. Helena and preserved in Jerusalem, but then had fallen into the hands of Chosroas, King of the Persians. The precious relic was recovered and returned to Jerusalem by Emperor Heraclius in 629. This day is also called the Exaltation of the Cross, Elevation of the Cross & Holy Cross Day. Our Mother Church sings of the triumph of the Cross, the instrument of our redemption. To follow Christ we must take up His cross, follow Him and become obedient until death, even if it means death on the cross. It is also, of course, the patronal feast of St Cross school.
