

GOSPEL: Matthew 3: 1-12

Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

OUR ADVENT PREPARATIONS FOR CHRISTMAS continue with the voice of St John the Baptist crying in the wilderness, "Prepare the Way of the Lord!" As the Gospel says, this is a fulfilling of Isaiah's prophecies. We were reflecting on this last Sunday: those ancient prophet's inspirations come to their fulfilment as God's plan for the coming of the Messiah starts to unfold, and His forerunner, John the Baptist, appears, to preach at the Jordan. It's so important for us to heed the call of St John the Baptist to repent and to convert our lives anew – with God's grace – over the course of Advent. It's why I emphasize and urge you to take the Advent opportunities for the Sacrament of Confession, the most important of which is the **Penitential Service: Tues 17th December, 11.30am & 7.30pm.**



THE ADVENT SCRIPTURE READINGS FROM ISAIAH, PSALMS, ST PAUL & ST MATTHEW – amongst others – are truly a very rich fare for us to feast on in this holy season. It's why I'm focussing on the nature and meaning of Scripture over the course of these Advent Sundays. This weekend we'll consider the psalms, those sacred hymns of Israel that beautify all our liturgy.



2019/20 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, *Verbum Domini*, n. 8

When we consider the basic meaning of the word of God as a reference to the eternal Word of God made flesh, the one Saviour and mediator between God and humanity, and we listen to this word, we are led by the biblical revelation to see that it is the foundation of all reality. The Prologue of Saint John says of the divine *Logos*, that "all things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made"; and in the *Letter to the Colossians* it is said of Christ, "the first-born of all creation," that "all things were created through him and for him." The author of the *Letter to the Hebrews* likewise states that "by faith we understand that the world was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was made out of things which do not appear."

The pilot was successful and we will participate in a full twelve-week shelter, on Sunday nights, starting 12th January. For 2020 we are looking to increase the number of volunteers on the overnight (22:30-07:00) shift, the 'peaceful' shift that oversees the venue whilst our guests sleep. Understandably, some may be concerned about volunteering on a Sunday night due to work commitments the following day; previously, volunteers have arranged to work from home on Monday whilst others took Monday off. In addition, some organisations allow additional days off for volunteering activities. Furthermore, volunteers are not expected to attend every Sunday night; volunteering for a single shift would be greatly appreciated!
