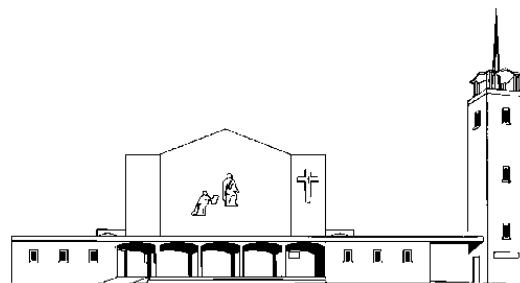

19th JANUARY 2020

GOSPEL: John 1: 29-34

Look, there is the lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE CHRISTMAS SEASON HAVING ENDED LAST SUNDAY, we now move into the Sundays of Ordinary Time, which we will celebrate in these next 6 weeks prior to Lent. After having heard of Jesus's Baptism last weekend, so today we hear ongoing testimony of St John the Baptist as he states categorically that Jesus is the "Lamb of God" and the "Chosen One of God." John was in a unique position to testify to Jesus, and we receive his words with conviction as to who Jesus truly is!

THIS WEEK THE CONFIRMATION CANDIDATES have formal enrolment onto their programme after the first sessions of catechesis. We are using a new programme this year, 'Transformed in Christ,' written by a very skilled catechist in the diocese of Southwark, and I hope that the candidates feel that they are truly touching Christ who so wants them to grow in the Spirit!

NEXT WEEKEND, AS PART OF THE 'YEAR OF THE WORD' CELEBRATIONS, and since it will be, for the first time, a new initiative of Pope Francis – the 'Sunday of the Word of God' – we will have a special blessing of, and opportunity to receive a copy of, the Gospel of Matthew. St Matthew's is the Gospel that we will be hearing from on Sundays for the bulk of 2020 (with the exception of a few Sundays, such as today!), its being the liturgical 'Year A.' It is not hard to read the Gospels: even though they are texts almost 2,000 years old, and originally written in Greek, they have a remarkable freshness and immediacy that of itself witnesses to the power of the Holy Spirit who inspired their sacred authors. I will be encouraging you to take a copy of the Gospel and to read it from cover to cover!

May these early weeks of 2020 be blessed as we offer the coming year to the Lord! Fr Philip

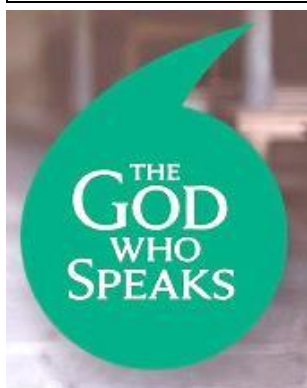

2019/20 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, *Verbum Domini*, n. 12

Jesus' mission is ultimately fulfilled in the paschal mystery: here we find ourselves before the "word of the cross." The word is muted; it becomes mortal silence, for it has "spoken" exhaustively, holding back nothing of what it had to tell us. The Fathers of the Church, in pondering this mystery, attributed to the Mother of God this touching phrase: "Wordless is the Word of the Father, who made every creature which speaks, lifeless are the eyes of the one at whose word and whose nod all living things move". Here that "greater" love, the love which gives its life for its friends, is truly shared with us.
