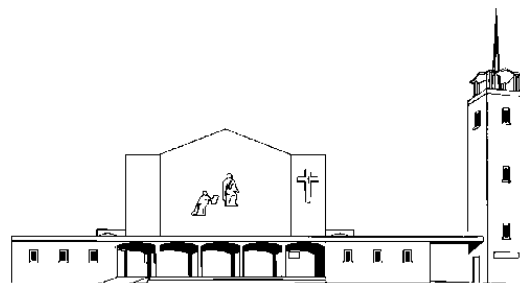

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

AS SOMEONE RECENTLY QUIPPED: "I hadn't meant to give up quite *that* much for Lent!" It is with great sadness that as Catholic community across the country we are in the position of having had to suspend, probably for many weeks, the public celebration of Mass. I write with more details inside the Newsletter some suggestions for your ongoing celebration of your daily faith. Above all, we are lucky that a local church, St Joseph & English Martyrs in Bishops Stortford, has Mass streamed online every day. Sunday Masses can be followed at <http://www.churchservices.tv/bishopsstortford> at 6pm Sat; and 9am, 11am and 6pm Sunday. I know it 'Laetare Sunday' and also 'Mothering Sunday': I wish you the blessings of these celebrations – especially to our parish's mothers – even in the midst of the challenges of this time!

All sorts of online resources are rapidly springing up, such as www.lentinisolation.com to support the Catholic people from day to day, during this 'fast from Mass,' this 'long Good Friday.' Additionally, there is the crucial **Re-dedication of England to Our Lady** set for next Sunday, 29th March, at around midday: PLEASE take part in this, in your homes and families, to re-dedicate our land to Our Blessed Mother, and implore her motherly intercession, using the prayers with the Newsletter or available [here](#).

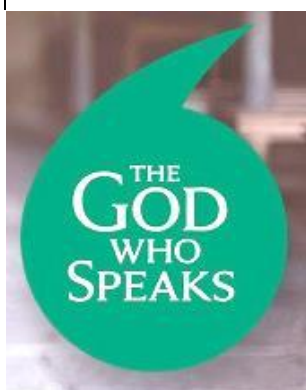

PRAYER & LITURGY

CARDINAL VINCENT has written to us all a [Pastoral Letter](#) this weekend, explaining the inevitable decision to suspend temporarily the suspension of public celebration of Holy Mass. This is available on the **pink sheets** with your Newsletter, or online at the link above.

LITURGY DURING THE PUBLIC SUSPENSION OF MASS: pretty much all the public ceremonies have had to be suspended. Mass will be celebrated by Fr Joshy & Fr Philip in private before (or after) the church is open.

- The suspension of public Mass by the bishop means that the *obligation to attend Sunday Mass is removed* for the duration of the suspension.
- *All the parish Masses*, for the intentions requested, will be offered without fail, even though in private. Please continue to ask for Masses to be offered, and these will be published in the Newsletter as usual.
- *The church will be open* daily for prayer as usual, from about 8.45am until the evening. *Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament* will take place each day as much as possible.
- *Mass can be followed online* at the church of the Dean, Fr Peter Harris – St Joseph & English Martyrs, Bishops Stortford (<http://www.churchservices.tv/bishopsstortford>) – at the following times: Saturday 6pm; Sunday 9am, 11am, 6pm; and weekdays 9.30am. This is not an obligation, but would be a pious practice in order to stay in touch with the rhythm of the Church's seasons and her devotional life.

RE-DEDICATION OF ENGLAND TO OUR LADY: this will take place across the country in parishes and homes on Sunday 29th March at around noon – or at any convenient time that day. It is *vitaly important*, especially at this time, that the rededication by each and every Catholic household and family goes ahead next Sunday, as it will be a powerful tide of prayer to Our Lady for the protection and blessing of England. Please offer these prayers for the Church in our country, and for the re-conversion of England.

LENT

DESPITE the suspension of public Mass, we can still exercise our Lenten disciplines with fervour.

Prayer: e.g. Following **Mass online** (see front page of Newsletter); reading our pocket copies of **St Matthew's Gospel** 'day by day'; **Stations of the Cross** (privately, in church or at home, with CTS booklets for sale in church porch); **Scripture Prayer Group** (Wed 10.15am in crypt – this can go ahead by our exercising 'physical distancing').

Fasting: e.g. refraining from meat on extra day(s) in the week, not just Friday; 'giving up' some of the classic treats such as sugar, cakes, chocolate, alcohol; fasting from the use of TV, social media, internet, etc.

Almsgiving: e.g. **Broxbourne FoodBank** (collection box in porch); establishing a '**Charity account**' with C.A.F. for regular charitable giving; **wall boxes** for 'CaFOD,' 'Poor & Needy,' and 'World Missions.'

Reconciliation: all the regular times on Saturday & Sunday, or at request during the weekdays.

FINANCE

THANK YOU to those parishioners who took part in the appeal last weekend with regard to 'planned giving.' All those cards which were filled out to set up Standing Orders have already been delivered to the relevant banks. This is a vital contribution that you are making to our parish finances at this time.
