My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

IT'S A SPECIAL PERIOD THAT WE FIND OURSELVES IN THESE DAYS: the original 'novena' of days between Ascension & Pentecost. In that time, Our Lady & the apostles (restored to numbering 12 by the election of St Matthias) took to prayer in private as they awaited the promised Holy Spirit promised by the Risen Jesus and re-iterated by Him as He ascended. 
THIS WEEK IS ALSO THE FINAL WEEK OF THE MARIAN MONTH OF MAY, so I do urge you to keep this also as part of your prayer, especially the Rosary. The Glorious Mysteries are particularly appropriate in these days between Ascension & Pentecost, and a powerful prayer for healing and hope as we reflect on the new life that the Risen Jesus gives to humanity as the Spirit is poured out upon the Church. 2019/20 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, *Verbum Domini*, n. 23

PRAYER & LITURGY

PUBLIC SUSPENSION OF MASS: Mass is celebrated by Fr Joshy & Fr Philip in private, plus they pray for the needs of the parish in their twice-daily Holy Hours with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. **Benediction takes place at 10am & 7pm every day, 7 days/week**, with the intention of blessing and protecting our whole parish – and the sick and the staff of our local hospital at Harlow – with the radiant presence of the Risen Lord Jesus Christ.

- The suspension of public Mass by the bishop means that the *obligation to attend Sunday Mass is removed* for the duration of the suspension.
- *Parish Masses*, for the intentions requested, will be offered without fail, even though in private. Please continue to ask for Masses to be offered, and these will be published in the Newsletter as usual. Fr Philip will also add in a Mass intention for each and every deceased person whose funeral he has had to celebrate at the cemetery/crematorium without Mass.

This is not an obligation, but would be a pious practice in order to stay in touch with the rhythm of the Church's seasons and her devotional life.

CATECHETICS

"RCIA" / FIRST HOLY COMMUNION / CONFIRMATION: classes all suspended for now. The celebration of Confirmation will be rescheduled by Bp McAleenan in the autumn. It is now clear that the First-Holy-Communion celebrations also cannot take place when originally scheduled, but it is not yet clear when the children's classes can resume for their preparation.


SOCIAL & MISCELLANEOUS
