# My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

WE COME TO THE FINAL DAY AND THE FINAL FEAST OF THIS EASTERTIDE: the great feast of Pentecost, celebration of the Descent of the Holy Spirit on Our Lady & the Apostles. It's most certainly a shame that we have not been able to celebrate any of Eastertide together at Mass in church - it's a great sadness, but we live in hope that soon we will have our chance to come to pray before Jesus in church restored to us. Even so, let's celebrate Pentecost in our hearts and in our homes, imploring the Holy Spirit to keep us faithful, holy, and focussed on our Blessed Lord.



THERE IS AS YET STILL NO DATE for the unlocking of the church doors, but as soon as the 'green light' is given, I will have the church opened. I envisage opening the church 8.45am-7pm each day, with an early

period of quiet Eucharistic adoration (till 10am) and another one later (6-7pm). Obviously, even for the use of the church just for private prayer there will be: (i) sanitiser 'hand gel' available at the entrance doors; (ii) a requirement that we keep at least 2m away from anyone else in church who is not a member of our household; and (iii) a daily routine of antiseptic cleansing of any surfaces likely to have been touched through the day.



### **PRAYER & LITURGY**

**PUBLIC SUSPENSION OF MASS:** Mass is celebrated by Fr Joshy & Fr Philip in private, plus they pray for the needs of the parish in their twice-daily Holy Hours with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. **Benediction takes place at 10am & 7pm every day, 7 days/week,** with the intention of blessing and protecting our whole parish — and the sick and the staff of our local hospital at Harlow — with the radiant presence of the Risen Lord Jesus Christ.

- The suspension of public Mass by the bishop means that the *obligation to attend Sunday Mass is removed* for the duration of the suspension.
- Parish Masses, for the intentions requested, will be offered without fail, even though in private. Please continue to ask for Masses to be offered, and these will be published in the Newsletter as usual. Fr Philip will also add in a Mass intention for each and every deceased person whose funeral he has had to celebrate at the cemetery/crematorium without Mass.
