Year A TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Gospel: Matthew 10: 26–33 *Do not be afraid of those who kill the body.*

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

JUNE IS THE MONTH DEDICATED TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS — the feast itself was on Friday, reminding us that it is the divine love burning in the human heart of Jesus that took Him to the Cross on that *Good* Friday. The <u>Litany of the Sacred Heart</u> is a beautiful prayer that you might wish to add to your devotions this month. May we respond to Jesus in fervent love for His Sacred Heart, whose love for us is undying.

SINCE MONDAY OUR CHURCH HAS THANKFULLY BEEN OPEN AGAIN for private prayer: 8.45am-7pm each day, with an early period of quiet Eucharistic adoration (till 10am) and another one later (6-7pm). I am extremely grateful to those parishioners who have volunteered to be available in 2-hr shifts to be present to provide supervision at this time.

Even for the use of the church just for private prayer there is: (i) sanitiser 'hand gel' available at all the entrance doors; (ii) a requirement that we keep at least 2m away from anyone else in church who is not a member of our household; and (iii) a daily routine of antiseptic cleansing of any surfaces likely to have been touched through the day. Please do not consider coming to church to pray if you have any of the classic symptoms of the coronavirus (fever, cough etc.).

THIS WEEKEND WAS TO HAVE BEGUN THE CELEBRATION OF FIRST HOLY COMMUNION this year for the children who started preparing in January, and who celebrated their First Confessions at the start of Lent. It is a great shame that First Communion has had to be postponed, and I'm sorry but we don't yet know when classes will be allowed to resume to complete their preparation.


Let us adore and praise the Sacred Heart of Jesus now and for all eternity!

PRAYER & LITURGY

ROSA RUSSO of Tregelles Road died on 8th June, aged 93.

GIUSEPPE COGNATA of Stortford Road died on 12th June, aged 85.

Their funerals will be held in private at the Hoddesdon Cemetery. Our sympathies go out to their families. *May they rest in peace*.

OUR CHURCH IS OPEN for roughly the usual times (8.45am – 7pm) with Adoration at the start of the day and end of the day (8.45–10am; 6–7pm). Low-level supervision operates, to ensure that all is safe: Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, or volunteer parishioners, will be available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

PUBLIC SUSPENSION OF MASS: Mass is celebrated by Fr Joshy & Fr Philip in private.

- The suspension of public Mass means that the *obligation to attend Sunday Mass is removed* for the duration of the suspension.
- Parish Masses, for the intentions requested, are offered without fail, though in private. Please continue to ask for Masses to be offered; these will be published in the Newsletter as usual. Fr Philip will also add a Mass intention for each and every deceased person whose funeral he has had to celebrate at the cemetery/crematorium without Mass.

This is not an obligation, but would be a pious practice in order to stay in touch with the rhythm of the Church's seasons and her devotional life.
