SAINTS PETER & PAUL

Gospel: Matthew 16: 13–19

You are Peter and I will give you the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE SOLEMN FEAST OF THE GREAT APOSTLES PETER & PAUL takes precedence over the 'ordinary Sunday of the Year' this weekend, and is a great celebration of these towering figures of the early Church. What they achieved in their 30+ years of ministry between Our Lord's Resurrection, and their martyrdoms in Rome in the 60s of the 1st c. AD, was colossal – between them they evangelized so many people.

THE ARCHBISHOPS OF ENGLAND have written us a Joint Letter regarding the


resumption of public celebrations of Mass which are allowed from Saturday 4th July; a copy is available inside your Newsletter. The obligation to attend Sunday Mass has not yet been restored, and therefore anyone frail, elderly, or with health concerns should know that they need not come to Sunday Mass yet. Additionally, not everyone who wishes to, can come to Sunday Mass every weekend, because we need to impose a safe capacity in the church given the requirements of being sufficiently spaced. The current capacity of the church is 50 – 90 depending on whether people come as singles, couples, or families. Only half the pews are available for sitting in. It may be that at times the doors will need to be closed for Mass if capacity has been reached. Please be aware of this, and do not be upset if you arrive and cannot get in.

In order to mitigate this problem with numbers, I propose:

(1) Only half those parishioners who feel it is right to come out to Mass should come next weekend: SURNAMES BEGINNING A-K (with L-Z the weekend of 11th-12th July). This will probably have to operate for the foreseeable future. I do ask you to abide by this, so as to give everyone equal rights to the chance to attend once more the Holy Mass. Weekday Masses are also an alternative for now.

(2) I will celebrate an extra 5pm Sunday Mass every weekend for the foreseeable future. Please use this as an alternative to whatever Mass you might usually attend. Please be flexible.

I am grateful to those parishioners volunteering in 2-hr shifts to be present to provide church supervision.



Anyone entering church must: (i) use sanitiser 'hand gel' at the entrance door; (ii) keep at least 2m away from anyone else in church who is not a member of one's household; and (iii) not have any of the classic symptoms of the coronavirus (fever, cough etc.).

May the Lord help us imitate the example of SS Peter & Paul! Fr Philip

TILL FRIDAY 3rd OUR CHURCH TIMETABLE

is for opening roughly the usual times (8.45am – 7pm) with Adoration at the start of the day and end of the day (8.45–10am; 6–7pm). Low-level supervision operates, to ensure that all is safe: Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, or volunteer parishioners, will be available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained. After Friday 3rd, the timetable will revert to the near-usual times for Mass & Adoration.

RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS: Mass will be celebrated by Fr Joshy & Fr Philip in private up to and including Friday.

AFTER FRIDAY (from Saturday 4th July):

- The Cardinal has released a <u>video</u> that you might like to view regarding the cautious, but welcome, resumption of public Masses.
- *The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended,* so no-one is expected to be at Sunday Mass if they feel it is not yet right for them.
- SURNAMES FOR Sat 4th (eve) & Sun 5th Masses: A-K only. Surnames L-Z the w/e of 11th/12th July. Please adhere to this to help give safe space to those attending Mass.
- *Extra Sunday Mass:* 5pm Sunday afternoon for the time being, as long as it is needed.
- The priests and the parish volunteer stewards will have to ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing. This means that *parishioners will have to be patient with any delays* in entering or departing Mass.
- Sunday Mass will be shortened, to compensate for the other delays and also to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There will be no congregational

singing, and no Bidding Prayers. Holy Communion will have to be distributed carefully and slowly.
