My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

I INVITE BACK TO SUNDAY MASS THIS WEEKEND ALL THOSE WITH <u>SURNAMES</u> <u>BEGINNING L-Z</u>. This alternating system with the alphabet will be our pattern for July, after which I will assess the situation. So, for clarity:

Surnames L-Z: 11th/12th July and 25th/26th July. Surnames A-K: 18th/19th July.


This is, for the time being, to ensure sufficient space in the church between parishioners. However, there was **plenty of space** last weekend, so I do urge as

many as are not frail, elderly, or 'shielding' because of health conditions, to be confident to come to Mass: Sat 6.30pm, Sun 9.15am, 11.15am, 5pm. (Please note the **extra Sunday 5pm Mass**.) We have volunteer stewards on hand at each Sunday Mass to assist you, to guide you to seating, and to space the procession to Holy Communion. I am grateful to those parishioners volunteering in 2-hr shifts to provide church supervision through the week; also those assisting as 'stewards' at Mass — these are essential duties at present, and a pre-condition for having our church open for prayer and for Mass.

THE GOSPEL PASSAGE FOR THIS SUNDAY continues our cycle from Matthew for 'Year A' which we have picked up again after the Lent & Easter seasons (and lockdown!). In ch. 13 Our Lord gives his 'Parable of the Sower.' Let's ask Him to make of our hearts a good and fruitful soil' in which His Word finds its home, and produces an abundant harvest of faith, virtues, and charity.

THE PARISH IS GRATEFUL FOR THE 40+ NEW STANDING ORDERS (set up since March) that have helped the parish finances during the pandemic crisis and the suspension of public Mass. 
May the Lord guide us unfailingly back to His Sacred Presence at the Holy Mass! Fr Philip



2019/20 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 29

The intrinsic link between the word and faith makes clear that authentic biblical hermeneutics can only be had within the faith of the Church, which has its paradigm in Mary's *fiat*. Saint Bonaventure states that without faith there is no key to throw open the sacred text: "This is the knowledge of Jesus Christ, from whom, as from a fountain, flow forth the certainty and the understanding of all sacred Scripture.

Therefore it is impossible for anyone to attain to knowledge of that truth unless he first have infused faith in Christ, which is the lamp, the gate and the foundation of all Scripture". ... Here we can point to a fundamental criterion of biblical hermeneutics: *the primary setting for scriptural interpretation is the life of the Church*.

PRAYER & LITURGY

MARIA SANTANIELLO of Middlefield Rd died on 25th June aged 82.

Her funeral will be held in private at the Hoddesdon Cemetery. Our sympathies go out to her family. *May she rest in peace*.

FRIDAY MASS THIS WEEK will be at 11.45am, not noon, to allow Fr Philip to attend St Cross School at the end of the school year. As a parish we send say a fond farewell to Mrs Kathryn Hall as she retires as Head of St Cross this week. With the virus outbreak, it has been a difficult moment at which to come to the end of her 14-yr tenure as Head, but we wish her all the very best in this next phase of her life. We thank her for all her years of teaching and Headship at St Cross, for touching the lives of hundreds of our parish children through her work.

RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- The Archbishops of England have released a <u>letter</u>, and the Cardinal has released a <u>video</u> regarding the cautious, but welcome, resumption of public Masses.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so no-one is expected to be at Sunday Mass if they feel it is not yet right for them in terms of their age or health.
- SURNAMES FOR THIS Sat 4th (eve) & Sun 5th Masses: <u>A-K only</u>. Surnames L-Z the w/e of 11th/12th July. Please adhere to this to help give safe space to those attending Mass.
- Extra Sunday Mass: 5pm Sunday afternoon for the time being, as long as it is needed.
- The priests and the parish volunteer stewards will have to ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing. This means that *parishioners will have to be patient with any delays* in entering or departing Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- Sunday Mass will be shortened, to compensate for the other delays and also to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There will be no congregational singing, no Bidding Prayers, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will have to be distributed carefully and slowly. You will be invited to give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Confessions available again in the usual confessional, but only kneeling at the grille/curtain, not face to face. Alternatively,

- ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.
- Sunday Mass online: Bishops Stortford <u>http://www.churchservices.tv/bishopsstor</u> <u>tford</u> or Westminster Cathedral <u>https://www.churchservices.tv/westminster</u>.
- A resource for daily spiritual nourishment is the 'Pause for Faith' YouTube channel hosted by Westminster priest Fr Stephen Wang: 30-min reflections, very accessible.

PARISH TIMETABLE: the church is open daily (c. 8am - 7pm) with Mass times restored and Adoration at the usual times. Additionally, Adoration at the end of the day (6-7pm) will continue, Monday-Friday. Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, or volunteer parishioners, will be available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

BAPTISMS which were missed in the last 3 months can now be re-scheduled. Please feel free to contact the Presbytery regarding this. Baptisms will be celebrated in single-family groups — maximum attendance to be 30.

HOUSE VISITS: Fr Philip will resume making house visits when it is safe to do so.


200 CLUB: the July draw for the 200 Club has produced the following winner: no. 2, Pat DiMaggio-Hunt. Congratulations to her!
