



FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

Gospel: Matthew 11: 25–30 *I am gentle and humble of heart.*

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

AFTER 15 LONG WEEKS' WAIT, FROM THIS SATURDAY YOU ARE WELCOME BACK AT THE CELEBRATION OF MASS! In order to provide a *check* on the numbers in church, at least until we are able to open more 'like usual' (and we don't know when that will be): I ask that only those who have **SURNAMES BEGINNING WITH A-K** come to Sunday Mass this weekend, with L-Z the weekend of 11th-12th




July), and then alternating this pattern for the weeks to come if it seems right. There is currently **also a Sunday 5pm Mass** here each weekend. Weekday Masses are also an alternative for now.

The obligation to attend Sunday Mass **has not yet been restored**, and therefore anyone frail, elderly, or with health concerns should know that they need not come to Sunday Mass yet. Additionally, not everyone who wishes to, can come to Sunday Mass every weekend, because we need to impose *a safe capacity* in the church given the requirements of being sufficiently spaced. The current capacity of the church is 50 – 90 depending on whether people come as singles, couples, or families. Only half the pews are available for sitting in. It may be that at times the doors will need to be closed for Mass if capacity has been reached. Please be aware of this, and do not be upset if you arrive and cannot get in.

I am very grateful to those parishioners volunteering in 2-hr shifts to provide church supervision through the week; also those assisting as 'stewards' at Mass. **Please remember**, if you have any of the classic symptoms of the coronavirus (fever, cough etc.), you need to stay away from church until you have had a test to prove you are not carrying the virus, or until you have recovered.

May the Lord who is "gentle & humble of heart" give us renewed faith at this time! Fr Philip

How completely at home Mary is with the word of God, with ease she moves in and out of it. She speaks and thinks with the word of God; the word of God becomes her word, and her word issues from the word of God. ... As we contemplate in the Mother of God a life totally shaped by the word, we realize that we too are called to enter into the mystery of faith, whereby Christ comes to dwell in our lives. Every Christian believer, Saint Ambrose reminds us, in some way interiorly conceives and gives birth to the word of God: even though there is only one Mother of Christ in the flesh, in the faith Christ is the progeny of us all. Thus, what took place for Mary can daily take place in each of us, in the hearing of the word and in the celebration of the sacraments.

PRAYER & LITURGY

RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- The Archbishops of England have released a <u>letter</u>, and the Cardinal has released a <u>video</u> regarding the cautious, but welcome, resumption of public Masses.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so no-one is expected to be at Sunday Mass if they feel it is not yet right for them in terms of their age or health.
- SURNAMES FOR THIS Sat 4th (eve) & Sun 5th Masses: <u>A-K only</u>. Surnames L-Z the w/e of 11th/12th July. Please adhere to this to help give safe space to those attending Mass.
- Extra Sunday Mass: 5pm Sunday afternoon for the time being, as long as it is needed.
- The priests and the parish volunteer stewards will have to ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing. This means that *parishioners will have to be patient with any delays* in entering or departing Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- Sunday Mass will be shortened, to compensate for the other delays and also to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There will be no congregational singing, no Bidding Prayers, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will have to be distributed carefully and slowly. You will be invited to give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Confessions available again in the usual confessional, but only kneeling at the grille/curtain, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.
- Sunday Mass online: Bishops Stortford <u>http://www.churchservices.tv/bishopsstor</u> <u>tford</u> or Westminster Cathedral <u>https://www.churchservices.tv/westminst</u> er.
- A resource for daily spiritual nourishment is the 'Pause for Faith' YouTube channel hosted by Westminster priest Fr Stephen Wang: 30-min reflections, very accessible.

PARISH TIMETABLE: the church is opening for roughly the usual times (c. 8am – 7pm) with Mass times restored and Adoration at the usual times. Additionally, **Adoration at the end of the day (6–7pm) will continue, Monday–Friday**. Low-level supervision operates, to ensure that all is safe: Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, or volunteer

parishioners, will be available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

BAPTISMS: as soon as Fr Philip is permitted to resume the celebration of Baptisms, it will be announced here, and the re-scheduling of missed Baptisms will commence.

BOXES OF OFFERTORY ENVELOPES: those who give via Offertory envelopes can continue to deliver your offering through the Presbytery letter-box. We still rely on your giving! NEW BOXES FOR APRIL 2020 ONWARDS available for collection from the Presbytery, if you haven't received yours through your letter-box.

HOUSEBOUND & SICK PARISHIONERS

It is vitally important that we 'look out for one another' in this present crisis. We have a number of parishioners offering to assist with shopping or running errands for anyone who is self-isolating, or elderly and choosing to remain safely at home. PLEASE, if you, or anyone you know, is in need of such help, then phone the Presbytery and we will co-ordinate it.

Please tell us if anyone is housebound, even temporarily, so they can be visited & have the opportunity to receive Holy Communion at home.

IF YOU GO IN TO HOSPITAL: Catholics in hospital are unlikely to receive an *automatic* visit from the Catholic Chaplain. If someone is sick in hospital, please let us know here at the Presbytery, and/or ask the staff on the ward, so that your loved one can be visited whilst in

hospital, and receive Holy Communion and any other Sacraments from the Chaplain.
