My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,


OUR LORD'S CHALLENGE TO PETER REGARDING FORGIVENESS continues the theme begun in last week's Gospel concerning reconciliation. As Christians we are



to be people for whom forgiveness is a central matter in daily life. Every day in the 'Our Father' we say, "forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." Our Lord Jesus has taught us without doubt that forgiving is something that we cannot set aside or ignore.

THE GOVERNMENT'S SLIGHT ADJUSTMENT IN NUMBERS PERMITTED IN SOCIAL SETTINGS does not affect the Church's liturgy, which is *not* a social setting. So, please be assured that our protocols in place across the Catholic Church for Mass and other services — specifically, hand sanitizing and the spacing-out of parishioners in church — allow us to congregate safely for the 'sacred mysteries,' which are our lifeline to God, the saving sacraments given to us by Jesus Christ. What is important is that we move back into a sense of Sunday Mass attendance being the norm again; there is no spiritual gift in this earthly life that surpasses the supreme gift of the Holy Eucharist.

WE HAVE PLENTY OF SPACE AT SUNDAY MASS, so I urge everyone to return to Sunday Mass, (unless you are 'shielding' because of health conditions). We have not yet exceeded 45 parishioners at any Sunday Mass in the past 10 wks, whereas we can easily fit 70–90 in the church even under current conditions. Please make sure that you come *in good time* for Mass (5 mins early minimum), because it is very difficult for the stewards to direct parishioners to seats once Mass has begun without causing great distraction to those already present. Saturday evening (6.30pm Mass) and Sunday evening (5pm) Mass are open to all, whilst Sunday-morning Masses are currently restricted to surnames as follows, on an alternating (fortnightly) basis: 9.15 & 11.15am Sundays ONLY: Surnames A-K: 13th Sept. However, I will review the restriction after this weekend's Masses, and decide if it is still helpful or not.



May the Gospel of today help us be people of true forgiveness. Fr Philip

PRAYER & LITURGY

RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- SURNAMES FOR Sun 13th Sept 9.15/11.15am Masses: <u>A-K only</u>. Surnames L-Z on 20th Sept, but this restriction is under review. Attendance at Sat 6.30/Sun 5pm NOT restricted by surname.
- Extra Sunday Mass: 5pm Sunday afternoon.
- Parish volunteer stewards will ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- Sunday Mass will be shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There will be no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass.
- Confessions available again in the usual confessional, but only kneeling at the grille/curtain, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

MASS INTENTIONS: there are many spare weekday & some weekend dates for intentions for you to request Mass in the coming weeks. Mass can be offered not only for the deceased, but also for the intentions of the sick, for special intentions, for thanksgiving etc. Intention can be published as 'Private Intention' if you so wish.

PARISH TIMETABLE: the church is open daily (c. 8am – 7pm) with Mass times and Adoration at the usual times. Additionally, Adoration at the end of the day (6–7pm) will continue, Monday-Friday. Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, or volunteer parishioners, will be available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY on Sundays is suspended for the time being.

FINANCE

PARISH FINANCE. The parish is grateful for the new Standing Orders that have helped parish finances during the pandemic. It is good to report that the parish now receives twice per month in SOs what it was receiving in January. However, the covering of parish costs is still a big problem. The parish bank a/c has decreased by about £17k since the start of the year.

Outgoings were cut enormously during the past 6 months, but many costs are ongoing, such as the safe upkeep of our buildings and grounds. We do those of you whose finances are stable at present to consider your parish giving, to help the parish out at a difficult time. CATECHETICS

"RCIA" / FIRST HOLY COMMUNION / CONFIRMATION: classes suspended for now. Thought will be given to how these catechetics courses can be safely resumed. But participants do now need to return to Sunday Mass in order for this to be possible.

JUSTICE & PEACE & PRO-LIFE

WINTER NIGHT SHELTER: The current situation has made planning very difficult due to the uncertainties resulting from the coronavirus. Last year's model, using dormitory style overnight accommodation in churches, will not be possible because of the high risks it poses to guests and volunteers alike. Single-venue options are currently being explored by the Council and the Night Shelter Core Team. It may turn out that we need significantly fewer volunteers compared to last year but we will keep you updated when we know more.

CORONAVIRUS - FOODBANK: Hundreds of people rely on generous donations to the local FoodBank from our parishioners and other local people. The need is for hygiene items, toilet paper, sanitary products etc., as well as sealed packages of NON-PERISHABLE foods: dry food, tins, and long-life milk etc. The FoodBank collection boxes are in the church porch.

You, Salvation of the Roman People, know what we need, and we are sure you will provide so that, as in Cana of Galilee, we may return to joy and to feasting after this time of trial.



FEAST OF THE WEEK

THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS 14*SEPTEMBER

This feast was observed in Rome before the end of the seventh century. It commemorates the recovery of the Holy Cross, which had been



placed on Mt. Calvary by St. Helena and preserved in Jerusalem, but then had fallen into the hands of Chosroas, King of the Persians. The precious relic was recovered and returned to Jerusalem by Emperor Heraclius in 629. This day is also called the Exaltation of the Cross, Elevation of the Cross & Holy Cross Day. Our Mother Church sings of the triumph of the Cross, the instrument of our redemption. To follow Christ we must take up His cross, follow Him and become obedient until death, even if it means death on the cross. It is also, of course, the patronal feast of St Cross School.
