Gospel: Matthew 21: 28-32

*Tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you.*

**My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,**

IT'S NOT EASY, IS IT, AS THE COUNTRY RESUMES FURTHER RESTRICTIONS on our social, cultural, and national life? We pray that the efforts of Government, Parliament, health services, and medical research – along with our own sensible efforts to contain the spread of the virus – all contribute gradually to overcoming this pandemic.

Thankfully the Church is able to continue its life of prayer and praise, uniting us in Church – or at home, if we are vulnerable – in the worship of Almighty God. As well as daily and Sunday Mass, and in the absence of so much else of parish life that is on hold (the groups, the faith formation, the social life), there is **daily Adoration on weekdays (Mon-Fri 6-7pm)** which is a quiet hour of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament to find some peace at the end of the day.

Also, I came across this lovely online retreat the other day, a series of reflections from Belmont Abbey, a monastery I know well. Dom Brendan leads it from in and around the monastery precincts and surrounding Herefordshire countryside. **WE STILL HAVE PLENTY OF SPACE AT SUNDAY MASS** – we had nearly 250 last weekend across all the Masses including the Italian Mass, but, by a long way, we have not reached the safe capacity: we can easily fit 70-90 in the church. Saturday evening (6.30pm Mass) and Sunday evening (5pm) Mass are open to all, whilst Sunday-morning Masses are restricted by surname, on an alternating (fortnightly) basis:

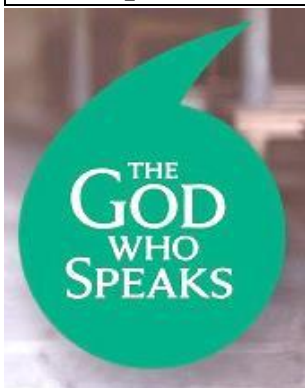
**9.15 & 11.15am Sundays ONLY: surnames A-K for 27<sup>th</sup> Sept.; surnames L-Z for 4<sup>th</sup> Oct.**

### **2019/20 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, *Verbum Domini*, n. 43**

Having considered the close relationship between the New Testament and the Old, we now naturally turn to the special bond which that relationship has engendered between Christians and Jews, a bond that must never be overlooked. Pope John Paul II, speaking to Jews, called them "our 'beloved brothers' in the faith of Abraham, our Patriarch." To acknowledge this fact is in no way to disregard the instances of discontinuity which the New Testament asserts with regard to the institutions of the Old Testament, much less the fulfilment of the Scriptures in the mystery of Jesus Christ, acknowledged as Messiah and Son of God. All the same, this profound and radical difference by no means implies mutual hostility. The example of Saint Paul shows on the contrary that "an attitude of

respect, esteem and love for the Jewish people is the only truly Christian attitude in the present situation, which is a mysterious part of God's wholly positive plan." Indeed, Saint Paul says of the Jews that: "as regards election they are beloved for the sake of their forefathers, for the gifts and the call of God are irrevocable!"



## PRAYER & LITURGY

**WE WELCOME INTO THE CHURCH** Ruben Gunputhram who will be baptised this weekend.

### **RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS:**

- **SURNAMES FOR Sun 27<sup>th</sup> Sept 9.15/11.15am Masses: A-K only.** Surnames L-Z on 4<sup>th</sup> Oct, but *this restriction is under review*. Attendance at Sat 6.30/Sun 5pm NOT restricted by surname.
- **Extra Sunday Mass: 5pm Sunday afternoon.**
- Parish volunteer stewards will ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- *Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.*
- *Sunday Mass is shortened*, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you *exit* the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- *The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended*, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- *Confessions* – available again in the usual confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

**MASS INTENTIONS:** there are many spare *weekday & some weekend dates* for intentions for you to request Mass in the coming weeks. Mass can be offered not only for the deceased, but also for the intentions of the sick, for special intentions, for thanksgiving etc. Intention can be published as 'Private Intention' if you so wish.

**PARISH TIMETABLE:** the church is open daily (c. 8am – 7pm) with Mass times and Adoration at the usual times. Additionally, **Adoration at the end of the day (6-7pm) will continue, Monday-Friday.** Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, or volunteer parishioners, will be available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

**CHILDREN'S LITURGY** on Sundays is suspended for the time being.

## FINANCE

**PARISH FINANCE.** The parish is grateful for the new Standing Orders that have helped parish finances during the pandemic. It is good to report that the parish now receives twice per month in SOs what it was receiving in January. However, the covering of parish costs is still a big problem. The parish bank a/c has decreased by about £17k since the start of the year.

Outgoings were cut enormously during the past 6 months, but many costs are ongoing, such as the safe upkeep of our buildings and grounds. We do those of you whose finances are stable at present to consider your parish giving, to help the parish out at a difficult time. **THE CATHOLIC HERALD** is now back on sale in the church porch. No longer a weekly magazine, it is now *monthly*, price £5. September issue now available.

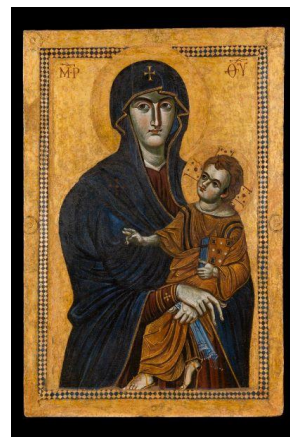

The liturgy celebrates the feast of these three archangels who are venerated in the tradition

of the Church. Michael ("Who is like God") was the archangel who fought against Satan and all his evil angels, defending all the friends of God. He is the protector of all humanity from the snares of the devil. Archangel Gabriel ("Strength of God") announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to the Virgin, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent prayers of the Christian people. Archangel Raphael ("Medicine of God") is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey.
