
ALL SAINTS' DAY

Gospel: Matthew 5: 1-12

Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE ORDINARY SUNDAY OF THE YEAR is replaced today by the solemn feast day of All Saints, the first of November. It's a feast that has been celebrated in the church for centuries, a tradition begun in Rome at the church (St Mary and all the Martyrs) which was converted in 610AD from the pagan Roman 'Pantheon' in the heart of the eternal city. Given that each of the martyrs could not have



their own feast day in the year, Pope Boniface IV decreed that the consecration day of that new church (13th May) should be that feast of 'All Saints.' Within a century or two, the date of the feast was moved to 1st November, and gradually this was decreed as a holy day for the Church.

This beautiful feast is a chance to acknowledge not just all the named, 'canonized,' saints of the Church, but indeed all those unnamed holy people who now dwell with God in heaven. The reading from Apocalypse this Sunday speaks of the blessed joy of the numerous heavenly host: "A great multitude that no-one could number, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, with palm branches in their hands and crying out with a loud voice." As we honour the saints, and as we meditate on their heavenly rest, we long to be with them, and we invoke their prayers to assist us on our earthly Christian journey, that we may not through grievous sins choose a life other than that which aims at heaven.

WE HAVE PLENTY OF SPACE AT SUNDAY MASS. We had c. 270 last weekend across all the Masses including the Italian Mass, but, by a long way, we have not reached safe capacity: we can easily fit 70–90 in the church. All weekend Masses are now once again open to all. I will continue to monitor numbers, ensuring we gather safely for the sacred mysteries of the Holy Mass. God bless, Fr Philip



2019/20 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 47

The interpretation of sacred Scripture would remain incomplete were it not to include listening to those who have truly lived the word of God: namely, the saints. Indeed, "viva lectio est vita bonorum." The most profound interpretation of Scripture comes precisely from those who let themselves be shaped by the word of God through listening, reading and assiduous meditation. It is certainly not by chance that the great currents of spirituality in the Church's history originated with an explicit reference to Scripture. I am thinking for example of Saint Anthony the Abbot, who was moved by hearing Christ's words: "if you would be perfect, go, sell what you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me."

NOVEMBER LIST OF THE DECEASED: lists for you to write the names of your departed relatives and friends are attached to the newsletter. Please return the lists to the presbytery, along with any Mass offering. During November, the lists will be kept on the altar and at least one Mass a day will be offered for the Holy Souls. Therefore, few other Mass intentions can be taken for November.

NOVEMBER PRAYERS AT CEMETERY: Fr Philip will lead the annual visit to the cemetery to pray the Rosary for the deceased members of the parish on **Sunday 1**st **Nov**. Please meet inside the main gate at Ware Road at **2pm**.

Fr Philip will also be attending Woollensbrook Cemetery on Saturday 7th November at 11.30am to pray and bless the graves.

Please note the "rule of 6" must be followed by each family group at a grave. Family groups must maintain distancing from one another. Mingling together is not permitted.

RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- The restriction by alphabet has been removed. Attendance at all Sunday Masses is now NOT restricted by surname.
- Parish volunteer stewards will ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- *Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.*
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- Confessions available again in the usual

confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

PARISH TIMETABLE: the church is open daily (c. 8am – 7pm) with Mass times and Adoration at the usual times. Additionally, Adoration at the end of the day (6–7pm) will continue, Monday–Friday. Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: volunteer parishioners or Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, are available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY on Sundays must still be suspended for the time being.

FINANCE

PARISH FINANCE is greatly helped by the many new Standing Orders set up this year. However, covering parish costs is still a big problem. The parish bank a/c has decreased by about £13k since the start of the year.

CATECHETICS

"RCIA" / FIRST HOLY COMMUNION / CONFIRMATION: classes suspended for now. Despite looking at options for a suitable space to take classes, there seems still no safe way to pursue First Holy Communion class with the children, so this will continue to be suspended until the New Year 2021, after which we will try to resume their preparation.

Confirmation: Fr Philip will gradually be inviting those who have already returned to Mass to be confirmed in groups of 3 or 4 at parish Sat eve / Sun Masses in the coming months. But there's no hurry for this — the door will not 'close.'

CORONAVIRUS - FOODBANK: Hundreds of people rely on generous donations to the local FoodBank from our parishioners and other local people.
