My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE GOSPEL PASSAGE TODAY IS SHORT AND TO THE POINT! Our Lord replies to His questioners not with a great parable such as those we have




heard of late on Sundays, but with a direct, memorable, and important text, one that we should have inscribed on our hearts as Jesus's followers: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind ... You shall love your neighbour as yourself."

DURING AN ONLINE MEETING WITH PRIESTS LAST WEEK, THE CARDINAL was at pains to convey his *immense* gratitude to volunteers across the diocese who are assisting, day-in, day-out, with supervising our open churches, and keeping them clean and safe for Mass. I would like to add my ongoing thanks to our parishioners who have been doing just that, now, for $4\frac{1}{2}$ months. It is a 'long haul,' but to have our church open for Mass and for private prayer each day is vital, a *sacramental lifeline*, so we can be here with Our Lord Jesus here in the Blessed Sacrament.

WE HAVE PLENTY OF SPACE AT SUNDAY MASS. We had c. 230 last weekend across all the Masses including the Italian Mass, but, by a long way, we have not reached safe capacity: we can easily fit 70–90 in the church. As a result, I am *removing* for a trial period the 'alphabet restriction' on surnames that we have had since July on Sundays for Mass. **All weekend Masses, therefore, are now once again open to all**. I will continue to monitor numbers, ensuring we gather safely for the sacred mysteries of the Holy Mass.

I SHALL BE AWAY FOR A BRIEF RETREAT THIS WEEK, Mon-Thurs, whilst it's half term, as I was unable to make my retreat this year back in May. I am very grateful to Fr Joshy for making himself available for the morning devotions and Mass each day, and the evening Adoration. I shall keep you all in my prayers.

May we live out the command of Jesus, "love God and love neighbour" each day. Fr Philip

A DECADE OF THE ROSARY will be recited before each Sunday Mass in this month of October, month of the holy rosary.

NOVEMBER LIST OF THE DECEASED: lists for you to write the names of your departed relatives and friends are attached to the newsletter. Please return the lists to the presbytery, along with any Mass offering. During November, the lists will be kept on the altar and at least one Mass a day will be offered for the Holy Souls. Therefore, few other Mass intentions can be taken for November.

NOVEMBER PRAYERS AT CEMETERY: Fr Philip will lead the annual visit to the cemetery to pray the Rosary for the deceased members of the parish on **Sunday 1**st **Nov**. Please meet inside the main gate at Ware Road at **2pm**.

Fr Philip will also be attending Woollensbrook Cemetery on Saturday 7th November at 11.30am to pray and bless the graves.

Please note the "rule of 6" must be followed by each family group at a grave. Family groups must maintain distancing from one another. Mingling together is not permitted.

RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- The restriction by alphabet has been removed. Attendance at all Sunday Masses is now NOT restricted by surname.
- Parish volunteer stewards will ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- *Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.*
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to

- avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- Confessions available again in the usual confessional, but only kneeling at the grille/curtain, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

PARISH TIMETABLE: the church is open daily (c. 8am – 7pm) with Mass times and Adoration at the usual times. Additionally, Adoration at the end of the day (6–7pm) will continue, Monday-Friday. Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: volunteer parishioners or Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, are available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY on Sundays must still be suspended for the time being.

FINANCE

PARISH FINANCE is greatly helped by the many new Standing Orders set up this year. However, covering parish costs is still a big problem. The parish bank a/c has decreased by about £13k since the start of the year.

CATECHETICS

"RCIA" / FIRST HOLY COMMUNION / CONFIRMATION: classes suspended for now. Despite looking at options for a suitable space to take classes, there seems still no safe way to pursue First Holy Communion class with the children, so this will continue to be suspended until the New Year 2021, after which we will try to resume their preparation.

Confirmation: Fr Philip is thinking of inviting those who have already returned to Mass to be confirmed in groups of 3 or 4 at parish Sat eve / Sun Masses in the coming months. But there's no hurry for this — the door will not 'close.'
