

The Lord asks us in the Gospel from Mk 13 that we "stay awake, ... and stand ready!" — this is the key theme of Advent: to hope, to wait, to long, for the Lord's

coming. Perhaps this year more than ever we can long for Christmas with spiritual hopes high; for a simple Christmas that is focussed on the coming of the Lord, then, and now, and again.

CHURCH OPENING: the church is open daily (c. 8.30am–7pm), with Adoration at the beginning and at the end of the day for an hour or more. Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: volunteer parishioners or Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, are available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

- The suspension of public Mass means that the *obligation to attend Sunday Mass is removed* for the duration of the suspension.
