

THIRD ("GAUDETE") SUNDAY OF ADVENT Year B

Gospel: John 1: 6-8, 19-28

There stands among you ... the one who is coming after me.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

GAUDETE SUNDAY - THE THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT - brings with it a certain new joy of expectation as Christmas draws nearer. The rosepink 3rd candle of the wreath, and rose-pink Mass vestments, point to this change, as we prepare to enter the second part of Advent from the 17th December, days in which we make our final preparation for Christmas. It means that this week the Christmas decorations begin

to go up: the trees and the crib. I urge you all to pop in to Church for private prayer when passing, to keep your hearts focussed on what Advent means, the imminent *coming* of Christ.

HAVING HEARD ST JOHN THE BAPTIST IN LAST WEEK'S GOSPEL (St Mark), we hear of him again today in the Gospel of St John: he is described as "a witness to speak for the Light." His message was irreplaceable, as he prepared the people for the appearance of that Light, the Messiah, Jesus, and he urged them all to prepare their hearts, "to clear the way," by repentance for their sins ...

Reconciliation (Confession) for Christmas: both Wed 16th and Tues 22nd Dec (any time 6-7pm); this will take place during the quiet evening Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and both Fr Joshy & I will be available for that hour (or more). PLUS: Fri 18th Dec 12.30–1.30pm.

I THANK THOSE WHO IMMEDIATELY RETURNED TO MASS after the November suspension, and I urge all who are not shielding because of health conditions to be here at Mass once more, as we move through Advent towards Christmas. We had c. 225 last weekend across all the Masses, so there is plenty of space still, despite the requirements of being spaced - particularly, there is room at Sunday 5pm Mass which I have added in recent months to give you more options. The same conditions apply as earlier in the year, regarding the wearing of face coverings, spacing out in church (alternate pews etc.), and the use of hand gel – for this reason we have stewards at Mass to help you; please politely follow their directions.



May the Lord cleanse our hearts, in readiness for His coming! Fr Philip

2019/20 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 50

To receive the Word means to let oneself be shaped by him, and thus to be conformed by the power of the Holy Spirit to Christ, the "only Son from the Father." It is the beginning of a new creation; a new creature is born, a new people comes to birth. Those who believe, that is to say, those who live the obedience of faith, are "born of God" and made sharers in the divine life: sons in the Son. As Saint Augustine puts it nicely in commenting on this passage from John's Gospel: "you were created through the Word, but now through the Word you must be recreated."

ADVENT

RECONCILIATION BEFORE CHRISTMAS: Fr Philip & Fr Joshy will be available during Adoration on **Wed 16th & Tues 22nd Dec** 6–7pm, in the Confessional & Lady Chapel. And also **Friday 18th Dec 12.30–1.30pm**.

DRIVE-IN CAROL SERVICE (CHURCHES TOGETHER) is now sold out.

CAROLS IN CHURCH will be played on the organ on Wednesday 16th & 23rd December from 2–3pm.

MIDNIGHT MASS/CHRISTMAS DAY: Mass will be at midnight on Christmas Eve and at 9.15am & 11.15am on Christmas Day. There will be stewards at each Mass who will show you where you need to sit. We do need to impose a safe capacity in the church given the requirements of being sufficiently spaced. The current capacity of our church is 50–90, depending on whether people come as singles, couples or families. Only half the pews are available for sitting in. The doors may well be closed once Mass begins, for this reason. Please be aware of this – be on time, and do not be upset if you arrive and cannot get in.

RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- Parish volunteer stewards will ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you *exit* the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- *Confessions* available again in the usual confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face. Alternatively,

ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

PARISH TIMETABLE: the church is open daily (c. 8am – 7pm) with Mass and Adoration at the usual times. Additionally, **Adoration at the end of the day (6–7pm) will continue, Monday– Friday**. Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: volunteer parishioners or Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, are available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.
