FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Gospel: Luke 1: 26–38

Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THIS FOURTH AND FINAL SUNDAY OF ADVENT brings us the moving Gospel account of the Annunciation, as God makes known to Mary via the Angel Gabriel His plan for salvation: the Incarnation of the Son of God. To reflect on this beautiful episode is a wonderful preparation for Christmas. As we imagine Our Lady's reaction to this incredible proposal from on high, we are drawn to appreciate the awesomeness of God's love for us, His wanting to enter creation and take our flesh, His desiring to be "God with us."

HERTFORDSHIRE NOW ENTERING INTO TIER 3 doesn't affect your access to the church or to Mass. All we have to be mindful of is strictly to *sit only*


with those of our own household or support bubble. Otherwise, it's a matter of the usual hygiene protocols: face coverings to be worn, hand gel to be used on entry and exit, and to avoid chatting or gathering together after Mass. We had 255 last weekend, so there remains *plenty* of space.

CHRISTMAS WEEK IS UPON US, a great and holy time, and so I draw your attention to these dates:

Reconciliation (Sacrament of Confession): **Tues 22**nd **Dec (any time 6–7pm)** during quiet evening Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and both Fr Joshy & I will be available for that hour (or more).

Christmas Masses: Midnight Mass; 9.15 & 11.15am on the day. Please note that for the sake of safety and in order to be fair to the stewards, **the church doors will be closed once Mass begins** (or earlier if church is at safe capacity). Therefore, you *must* be early for Mass (arrive at least 5–10mins before Mass).



ADVENT & CHRISTMAS

RECONCILIATION BEFORE CHRISTMAS: Fr Philip & Fr Joshy will be available during Adoration on **Tues 22**nd **Dec** 6–7pm, in the Confessional & Lady Chapel.

DRIVE-IN CAROL SERVICE (CHURCHES TOGETHER) is now sold out. But they will be streamed online on the parish FaceBook page, 5.30pm and 7.30pm Sunday 20th.

CHRISTMAS MASS will be at midnight on Christmas Eve and at 9.15am & 11.15am on Christmas Day. There will be stewards at each Mass who will show you where you need to sit. We need to impose a safe capacity in the church given the requirements of being sufficiently spaced. The current capacity of our church is 50–90, depending on whether people come as singles, couples or families. Only half the pews are available for sitting in. The doors will be closed once Mass begins, for this reason, so you need to be on time (5–10mins before Mass, at least). Please be aware of this — and do not be upset if you arrive and cannot get in.

DIOCESAN PRAYERS FOR CHRISTMAS octave: especially if you feel you are not able to come to Christmas Mass at this time, you might think of coming to another, quieter weekday Mass in the Christmas Octave which lasts till 1st January. The diocese has also produced a wonderful <u>prayer sheet</u> for use at home, to guide you through this festive octave.

CRIB APPEAL: our Crib Offerings are donated to the *Catholic Children's Society*. Since March, the Society has provided emergency food & essentials, as well as mental-health services, for over 5,500 children & their parents/carers. These families have faced desperate situations due to the coronavirus pandemic. There are many more families in need of support, so please consider making a donation.

RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS:

 Parish volunteer stewards will ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.

- *Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.*
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- Confessions available again in the usual confessional, but only kneeling at the grille/curtain, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

PARISH TIMETABLE: the church is open daily (c. 8am – 7pm) with Mass and Adoration at the usual times. Additionally, Adoration at the end of the day (6–7pm) will continue, Monday-Friday. Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: volunteer parishioners or Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, are available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

FINANCE

PARISH FINANCE is greatly helped by the many new Standing Orders set up this year. However, covering parish costs is still a big problem. The parish bank a/c has decreased by about £13k since the start of the year.

The need is for hygiene items, toilet paper, sanitary products etc., as well as sealed packages of NON-PERISHABLE foods: dry food, tins, and long-life milk etc. The FoodBank collection boxes are in the church porch.
