

## My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

IT IS A GREAT BLESSING THAT WE HAVE RESUMED THE PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF MASS, and I urge you all to return again to Mass, as we were able to in July-October this year. The same conditions apply, regarding the wearing of face coverings, spacing out in church (alternate pews etc.), and the use of hand gel on entry — for this reason we have stewards at each Mass to help you.



ADVENT IS NOW IN FULL SWING, this holy and gentle season of preparation for the feast of Christ's birth, and we should treasure and make good use of this sacred time. St John the Baptist speaks to us movingly on these middle Sundays of the season, calling out to us from the pages of the Gospel, as Isaiah had prophesied 8 centuries earlier: "Prepare the way for the Lord!" This fore-runner of the Messiah, Jesus's own cousin, makes clear to us that the most important preparation for Christmas is the spiritual readiness of our hearts, for Christ to come. Let us "prepare the way"!


Although Advent won't be quite as usual this year, as we can't have all the same celebrations, yet I draw your attention to these opportunities:

Reconciliation (Confession) for Christmas: both Wed 16<sup>th</sup> and Tues 22<sup>nd</sup> Dec (any time 6–7pm); this will take place during quiet Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and both Fr Joshy & I will be available for that hour (or more).

**Drive-In Carol Service**: **Sun 20**<sup>th</sup> **Dec** (5.30pm or 7.30pm) at Paradise Wildlife Park. Since we cannot have congregational singing in church at this time, an ideal alternative is organised by Churches Together for the final Sunday of Advent. # 2019/20 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 50

The Lord speaks his word so that it may be received by those who were created "through" that same word. "He came among his own" (Jn 1:11): his word is not something fundamentally alien to us, and creation was willed in a relationship of familiarity with God's own life. Yet the Prologue of the Fourth Gospel also places us before the rejection of God's word by "his own", who "received him not" (Jn 1:11). Not to receive him means not to listen to his voice, not to be conformed to the Logos. On the other hand, whenever men and women, albeit frail and sinful, are sincerely open to an encounter with Christ, a radical transformation begins to take place.

#### **ADVENT**

**RECONCILIATION BEFORE CHRISTMAS:** 

Fr Philip & Fr Joshy will be available during Adoration on **Wed 16**<sup>th</sup> & **Tues 22**<sup>nd</sup> **Dec** 6–7pm, in the confessional & Lady Chapel. Fr Philip will also hear confessions on request.

**DRIVE-IN CAROL SERVICE (CHURCHES TOGETHER)** will be held at Paradise Wildlife Park on **20**<sup>th</sup> **December** at 5.30pm & 7.30pm. Bookings are now live, so please visit:

CAROLS IN CHURCH will be played on the organ on Wednesday 9th December from 2.30-3.30pm & on 16th & 23rd December from 2-3pm.

MIDNIGHT MASS/CHRISTMAS DAY: Mass will be at midnight on Christmas Eve and at 9.15am & 11.15am on Christmas Day. There will be stewards at each Mass who will indicate where you need to sit. We do need to impose a safe capacity in the church given the requirements of being sufficiently spaced. The current capacity of our church is 50–90, depending on whether people come as singles, couples or families. Only half the pews are available for sitting in. It may be that the doors will need to be closed for Mass if the capacity has been reached. Please be aware of this, and do not be upset if you arrive and cannot get in.

#### **RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASS:**

- Parish volunteer stewards will ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- *Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.*
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to

- avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- Confessions available again in the usual confessional, but only kneeling at the grille/curtain, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

PARISH TIMETABLE: the church is open daily (c. 8am – 7pm) with Mass and Adoration at the usual times. Additionally, Adoration at the end of the day (6–7pm) will continue, Monday-Friday. Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: volunteer parishioners or Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, are available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

SICK & RETIRED PRIESTS' COLLECTION: envelopes are attached to the newsletter. Please give your envelope into the collection box or post it through the presbytery door. Most priests offer their resignation at 75, but many continue to serve in our schools, hospitals,

hospices & parishes. By supporting the fund, you can help cover essential costs and give them peace of mind that in the event of an emergency, their needs will be met. You can also

#### **CATECHETICS**
