Gospel: Mark 1: 7–11 'You are My Son, the Beloved. My favour rests on You.'

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

I WAS VERY SORRY TO HAVE TO ANNOUNCE SUDDENLY, last weekend, a brief suspension of public Mass because of health reasons, but all being well the full programme of Masses will resume on Wed 13th, along with morning & evening Adoration, and Morning Prayer, at the usual times.

I AM GRATEFUL THAT THE DEAN, FR PETER HARRIS from the parish in Bishops Stortford, has offered to come and celebrate Sunday Masses this weekend (10th Jan) - Sunday 9.15 & 11.15am ONLY - and these will be the *only* Masses, along with the Sat 4pm Italian Mass, this weekend. The Mass intentions for the other days have all been celebrated in private, or have been rescheduled to other January dates.




THE FINAL FEAST OF THE CHRISTMAS SEASON today, the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, completes the cycle of celebrations of His infancy with this 'leap forward' to His Baptism in the River Jordan at the age of about 30. We also commence Year-B's reading-through of St Mark's Gospel, the most concise and 'urgent' of the accounts of Our Lord's ministry. After all those years in Nazareth, for Jesus's earthly ministry to be beginning in earnest — with the Father's voice giving authoritative testimony, and the Spirit's anointing - must have been an astonishing occasion, for Our Lord Himself, and also

for those who were there at the Jordan with St John the Baptist. What the Lord brought to the world in that moment, the consecration of the waters of Baptism as a saving Sacrament, means that this occasion effectively touches our lives too, very profoundly, in that sacred, cherished day, of our own Baptism.

NATIONAL TIER-5 RESTRICTIONS still permit your access to Mass and the church, which is open c. 8.30am-6pm daily. We must strictly adhere to the usual hygiene protocols: face coverings to be worn; hand gel to be used on entry & exit; sitting only with those of our own household or support bubble; and to avoid chatting or gathering together in or outside church. The church door handles and pews are sanitized regularly.

May the Lord sustain you spiritually with faith & hope through this pandemic.

PRAYER & LITURGY

CRIB APPEAL: LAST CHANCE! Crib Offerings are donated to the *Catholic Children's Society*. Since March, the Society has provided emergency food & essentials, as well as mentalhealth services, for 5,500+ children & their parents/carers. These families have faced desperate situations due to the pandemic. There are many more families in need of support, so please consider making a donation.

BRIEF SUSPENSION OF MASS: only the following Sunday Masses - Sat 4pm (Italian); Sun 9.15am & 11.15am - will be offered publicly prior to Wed 13th Jan. From Wednesday onwards, the usual timetable is expected to resume, with the church open daily (c. 8am -7pm) and Mass and Adoration at the usual times. Adoration at the end of the day (6-7pm) will continue, Monday-Friday (from 13th Jan). Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: volunteer parishioners are available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- Parish volunteer stewards ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.

- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- Confessions available again in the usual confessional, but only kneeling at the grille/curtain, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

FINANCE

PARISH FINANCE is greatly helped by the many new Standing Orders set up last year. However, covering parish costs is still a big problem. The parish bank a/c decreased by about £11.5k across 2020.
