



THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME24th JANUARY 2021

Gospel: Mark 1: 14–20 *Repent, and believe the Good News.*

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE 'SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD' as Pope Francis has now designated the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time is a moment to reflect on the central place that Sacred Scripture holds in the life of the Church. Each year, the relevant Gospel for the year (this year, St Mark's, for Year 'B') has started to be read by this Sunday in the year. As you see, that's some verses in Mk ch. 1 today – Our Lord




beginning His ministry at the Sea of Galilee, with an urgency: giving his essential message, "Repent and believe the Good News," and calling the first four of His Apostles from their fishing.

BELMONT ABBEY IN HEREFORD (<u>www.belmontabbey.org.uk</u>) has a lovely set of <u>reflections on the</u> <u>Gospel of Mark</u> – a series of 5 short videos totalling about an hr. They would be well worth watching, as they give a great insight into the nature of the Gospel we hear in the year ahead.

WE HAVE RECEIVED THE SAD NEWS OF THE DEATH OF KEITH NEWELL. For very many years Keith has been a key member of the Sunday 9.15am Folk Group, setting up and playing guitar every fortnight for us, and being the organiser of the group for several years, too. Our sympathies go out to his family, and we offer many fervent prayers for him, that he may rest in peace.

NATIONAL TIER-5 RESTRICTIONS still permit your access to Mass and the church, which is open c. 8.15am– 7pm daily. We must strictly adhere to the usual hygiene protocols: face coverings to be worn; hand gel to be used on entry & exit; *sitting only with those of our own household or support bubble* and at least 2m from anyone else; and to avoid chatting or gathering together in or outside church. Surfaces that are touched, such as door handles and pews are sanitized regularly.

2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 53

There is great need for a deeper investigation of the relationship between word and sacrament in the Church's pastoral activity and in theological reflection. Certainly "the Liturgy of the Word is a decisive element in the celebration of each one of the sacraments of the Church"; in pastoral practice, however, the faithful are not always conscious of this connection, nor do they appreciate the unity between gesture and word. It is "the task of priests and deacons, above all when they administer the sacraments, to explain the unity between Word and Sacrament in the ministry of the Church."

CRIB APPEAL: LAST CHANCE! Crib Offerings are donated to the *Catholic Children's Society.* Since March, the Society has provided emergency food & essentials, as well as mentalhealth services, for 5,500+ children & their parents/carers. These families have faced desperate situations due to the pandemic. There are many more families in need of support, so please consider making a donation.

PARISH TIMETABLE: sees the church open daily (c. 8.15am – 7pm) and Mass and Adoration at the usual times. Evening **Adoration (6-7pm) continues Monday-Friday**. Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: volunteer parishioners are available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- Parish volunteer stewards ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you *exit* the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.

- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- *Confessions* available again in the usual confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

FINANCE

PARISH FINANCE is greatly helped by the many new Standing Orders set up last year. However, covering parish costs is still a big problem. The parish bank a/c decreased by about £11.5k across 2020.

"RCIA" / FIRST HOLY COMMUNION / CONFIRMATION: classes suspended. As soon as it seems safe to resume classes and preparation for these sacraments, we will do so, but it is clear that for now this is not yet the case.

CORONAVIRUS – FOODBANK: Hundreds of people rely on generous donations to the local FoodBank from our parishioners and other local people. The need is for hygiene items, toilet paper, sanitary products etc., as well as sealed packages of NON-PERISHABLE foods: dry food, tins, and long-life milk etc. The FoodBank collection boxes are in the church porch.

RACIAL JUSTICE: This year's Racial Justice Sunday, is 31st January. The effects of the Coronavirus pandemic, the killing of George Floyd and the powerful message on fraternity and equality by Pope Francis in his encyclical letter 'Fratelli Tutti,' speak of the need to actively oppose racism and pursue racial justice with renewed vigour.
