




A Blessed & Happy ongoing Christmastide to you! Please keep up your Christmas decorations at least to the 6th January (Epiphany) - or even to the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (Sun 10th) — because our Christmas celebration as Christians is not a one-day wonder! We keep a season of several feasts, of

which Christmas Day is just the first: we have the Octave of Christmas, culminating in Mary, Mother of God (Jan 1st); and then the second full week of Christmas in the middle of which we keep Epiphany. These are all sacred days of celebration, and I urge you to keep your cribs up at home — and to visit the parish Crib — and to maintain your focus on the wonder of God made man.

St John's Beautiful and famous Prologue to the Gospel is the text we hear at Mass today, as we contemplate the great mystery of the birth of the Son of God. St John reminds us that this was the plan of God from the beginning, nurtured in His loving heart, and brought to fulfilment when "the Word became flesh, He dwelt amongst us, and we saw His glory."

HERTFORDSHIRE'S BEING IN TIER 4 doesn't affect your access to the church, which is open c. 8.30am–6pm daily; it's a matter of the usual hygiene protocols: face coverings to be worn, hand gel to be used on entry and exit, and to avoid chatting or gathering together. The church pews are sanitized regularly.

# 2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 52

In considering the Church as "the home of the word", attention must first be given to the sacred liturgy, for the liturgy is the privileged setting in which God speaks to us in the midst of our lives; he speaks today to his people, who hear and respond. Every liturgical action is by its very nature steeped in sacred Scripture. In the words of ... Sacrosanctum Concilium, "sacred Scripture is of the greatest importance in the celebration of the liturgy. From it are taken the readings, which are explained in the homily and the psalms that are sung. From Scripture the petitions, prayers and liturgical hymns receive their inspiration and substance. From Scripture the liturgical actions and signs draw their meaning."

## **PRAYER & LITURGY**

MARY KNIVETT, formerly of Benstede Court, Hoddesdon died recently, aged 88. Her funeral will be held in Chichester where she has lived near her daughter since 2019. Mass will be offered here for Mary on 21st January.

**WE WELCOME INTO THE CHURCH** Sienna Ednie who will be baptised this weekend.

**CRIB APPEAL:** our Crib Offerings are donated to the *Catholic Children's Society*. Since March, the Society has provided emergency food & essentials, as well as mental-health services, for over 5,500 children & their parents/carers. These families have faced desperate situations due to the coronavirus pandemic. There are many more families in need of support, so please consider making a donation.

PARISH TIMETABLE: the church is open daily (c. 8am – 7pm) with Mass and Adoration at the usual times. Additionally, Adoration at the end of the day (6–7pm) will continue, Monday–Friday. Low-level supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe: volunteer parishioners or Fr Philip or Fr Joshy, are available in church/porch. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

## **CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:**

- Parish volunteer stewards ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- *Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.*
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- Confessions available again in the usual

confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

## **FINANCE**

**PARISH FINANCE** is greatly helped by the many new Standing Orders set up this year. However, covering parish costs is still a big problem. The parish bank a/c has decreased by about £12.5k since the start of the year.
