

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Gospel: Mark 9: 2–10 – This is my Son, the Beloved.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

NOW THAT OVER 1/3 OF THE ADULT POPULATION, including the vast majority of the most vulnerable, has received its first vaccination dose, we can thankfully begin the path back to restoring our parish life, especially through attendance at Sunday Mass. We had around 185 parishioners here last Sunday, so there is plenty of space, even whilst we still conform to the pandemic protocol of spacing ourselves out. In particular the two evening Masses (Sat 6.30pm and Sun 5pm) are currently under-attended, so offer great opportunities for coming again safely to Mass.




28th FEBRUARY 2021

ON THIS SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT, we are taken to the Mount of the Transfiguration, traditionally thought to be Mt Tabor, and we hear of Jesus's awesome revelation of His radiant divinity to three of the apostles. May this divine light of His really light up our souls this Lent!

PRAYING: in addition to what I mentioned last week – weekday Mass; twice-weekly Stations of the Cross (Fri & Sat); quiet evening Adoration (Mon-Fri 6-7pm); and weekly prayer sheet (enclosed) – I have re-stocked the CTS racks with Lent publications, including 'Stations of the Cross' booklets.

FASTING/ALMSGIVING: an especial focus for us this weekend is our annual Lent CaFOD Fast Day – you can either give using the envelope attached to the Newsletter, or via CaFOD's own website: <u>https://cafod.org.uk/Give/Donate-to-CAFOD/Lent-Appeal</u>.

I HAVE TAKEN OUR GREAT PASCHAL CANDLESTICK to be restored by a young Catholic artist over in Dunstable. She will be completing this in good time for Easter, and has some great ideas about how best to refurbish it. The cost is a few £100s, and we have already received donations in excess of 1/3 of this amount. 2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 56

We come to see that at the heart of the sacramentality of the word of God is the mystery of the Incarnation itself: "the Word became flesh," the reality of the revealed mystery is offered to us in the "flesh" of the Son. The Word of God can be perceived by faith through the "sign" of human words and actions. Faith acknowledges God's Word by accepting the words and actions by which he makes himself known to us. The sacramental character of revelation points in turn to the history of salvation, to the way that word of God enters time and space, and speaks to men and women, who are called to accept his gift in faith. MADGE PHELAN of Park Road died recently, aged 88.

FILOMENA TONA of Stanstead Road died recently, aged 87.

GIUSEPPINA RICOTTA of Hailey Lane died recently, aged 89.

Their funerals will be held in private. Our sympathies go out to their families. May they rest in peace.

CHURCH OPENING: open daily (c. 8.30am-7pm), with Adoration at the beginning and at the end of the day (Mon-Fri). Low-level volunteer parishioners from supervision operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- Parish volunteer stewards ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for . sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues • to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- Confessions available again in the usual • confessional, but only kneeling at the grille/curtain, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.
- Funerals: parishioners cannot at present just 'turn up' for a funeral, since there is a cap of 30 mourners for funerals, and these 30 will generally be invited directly by the family.

PARISH ACCOUNTS: income and expenditure summary for 2020 is now available to view on the noticeboard at the back of the church.

GIFT AID: Many parishioners have already signed Gift-Aid forms, which enables the parish to collect the tax on the donations they have made through envelopes or standing orders. There is no further cost to the donor but the parish is able to claim another £1 for every £4 donated under Gift Aid. You will need to be a UK taxpayer to sign a Gift-Aid form and you will find some forms at the back of the church beside the newsletters. If your circumstances have changed and you pay insufficient or no tax, please inform the Presbytery a.s.a.p., and your Gift-Aid declaration will be cancelled.

HOUSEBOUND & SICK PARISHIONERS

Please tell us if anyone is housebound, even temporarily, so they can be visited & have the opportunity to receive Holy Communion at home.


CHURCH CLEANING – a special rota will be devised now that the church is open again.
