

Year B FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT, 'LAETARE SUNDAY' 14th MARCH 2021

Gospel: John 3: 14–21 – God sent his Son so that through him the world might be saved.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT IS *LAETARE* **SUNDAY**, and as the middle Sunday of our penitential season we allow ourselves to "Rejoice" at the prospect of Easter Sunday now being just 3 weeks away. It's also, of course, **MOTHERING SUNDAY** – so a very happy Mothers' Day to all our parish mothers; may God bless you!

We hear in the Gospel today the famous words that Our Lord utters during His night-time meeting with Nicodemus, a leading Pharisee:


"*God so loved that world, that He sent His only Son*" (Jn 3:16). These are words that should echo in our hearts every day, in thanksgiving. Our divine Lord is with us in this world: He has entered human history to be with us, to guide, teach, and save us. Yes, even in the most difficult of circumstances, therefore, and even in the middle of Lent, we should "*Laetare*!" – we should *rejoice* at all that He has done for us.

NOW THAT ALMOST HALF THE ADULT POPULATION has received its first vaccination dose – and the majority of our schoolchildren are back in the classroom – we need our parish families to be coming back now to Sunday Mass. Naturally there will be some parishioners medically 'shielding' owing to significant health issues, but otherwise we all need to be 'turning the corner' and in this 2nd half of Lent to be returning to the practice of Sunday Mass. There are 5 Sunday Masses including the Italian Mass, so there are plenty of opportunities, and plenty of room for spacing out in accordance with the protocol.

LENT PRAYING: Sunday & weekday Mass is the best possible prayer, and this week there are the great feasts of **St Patrick** (Wed) and **St Joseph** (Fri); also, twice-weekly **Stations of the Cross** (Fri & Sat); **quiet evening Adoration** (Mon-Fri 6-7pm); and I offer you the fourth of my <u>weekly prayer sheets</u>.

LENT FASTING: if you've not yet settled on any 'giving up,' this Lent, then take some time to reflect now on what pleasure you might set aside in the coming 3 wks to honour the Lord with the gift of yourself.

2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 56

Saint Jerome speaks of the way we ought to approach both the Eucharist and the word of God: "We are reading the sacred Scriptures. For me, the Gospel is the Body of Christ; for me, the holy Scriptures are his teaching. ... When we approach the [Eucharistic] Mystery, if a crumb falls to the ground we are troubled. Yet when we are listening to the word of God, and God's Word and Christ's flesh and blood are being poured into our ears yet we pay no heed, what great peril should we not feel?"



PRAYER & LITURGY

CHURCH OPENING: open daily (c. 8.30am-7pm), with **Adoration** at the beginning and at the end of the day (Mon-Fri). Low-level supervision from volunteer parishioners operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- Parish volunteer stewards ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- *Sunday Mass is shortened,* to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you *exit* the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- *Confessions* available again in the usual confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.
- Funerals: parishioners cannot at present just 'turn up' for a funeral, since there is a cap of 30 mourners for funerals, and these 30 will generally be invited directly by the family.

YEAR OF ST JOSEPH: Pope Francis declared that 8th Dec 2020–21 is to be a 'Year of St Joseph' – <u>prayer cards</u> are available for this, and in March, the month of Joseph, and with his feast-day this Friday, extra devotion to him would be very appropriate.

LENT

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: the "Way of the Cross" is prayed in church each Friday (12.30pm after Mass) & Saturday (9.30am, before Mass). **Please note: you will need to remain in your place in the pews and not follow the priest.**

LENTEN ALMS in support of the <u>Cardinal's</u> <u>Lenten charity</u>: you will find envelopes by the newsletters. Please post envelopes through Presbytery door, or sacristy door by St Anthony.

FINANCE

NEW BOXES OF OFFERTORY ENVELOPES will be available *after next weekend* in readiness for the new tax year which begins just after Easter. We will need you to collect your box from the Presbytery office this year.

PARISH FINANCE: covering parish costs still remains a big problem, and the parish bank a/c decreased by about £12k across 2020. Thank you so much to all who continue to give regularly by S.O., or by envelope through this time.

We do ask those of you whose finances are stable at present to consider your parish giving, to help the parish out at a difficult time. PARISH ACCOUNTS: income and expenditure summary for 2020 is now available to view on the noticeboard at the back of the church.

GIFT AID: Many parishioners have already signed Gift-Aid forms, which enables the parish to collect the tax on the donations they have envelopes through made or standing orders. There is no further cost to the donor but the parish is able to claim another £1 for every £4 donated under Gift Aid. You will need to be a UK taxpayer to sign a Gift-Aid form and you will find some forms at the back of the church beside the newsletters. If your circumstances have changed and you pay insufficient or no tax, please inform the Presbytery a.s.a.p., and your Gift-Aid declaration will be cancelled.

HOUSEBOUND & SICK PARISHIONERS

Please tell us if anyone is housebound, even temporarily, so they can be visited & have the opportunity to receive Holy Communion at home.
