

Gospel: John 12: 20–32 — If a grain of wheat falls on the ground and dies, it yields a rich harvest.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

WITH THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT, TODAY, WE ENTER INTO PASSIONTIDE. The statues are covered with their purple drapes, and we begin the most reflective, most sombre period of the Church's year. In the Gospel passage from Jn 12, Our Lord speaks of openly of His death, and of His being "lifted up from the earth," a direct reference to His crucifixion. He offers His life as a sacrifice, not as a mere victim of circumstance; His self-giving unto death is His loving choice for our salvation!

TUESDAY'S NATIONAL DAY OF REFLECTION: the Cardinal, along with the Archbishop of Liverpool, has addressed a Letter to Catholics to commemorate in prayer, along with the whole country, the anniversary of the initial 'lockdown' last March. His



text is also broadly contained within my fifth Lenten prayer sheet, included with your Newsletter today.

NOW THAT WE APPROACH THE MOST SACRED TIME OF THE YEAR, I urge all of you are not 'shielding' for medical reasons to come back to Sunday Mass. It's a year, now, since the pandemic restrictions were first imposed to control the outbreak, but with the vaccine rollout proceeding well, and with new weekly infections in our area down to very low levels (24 per 100k - that's under 1 in 4000), we should be confident again in attending Mass. There are 5 Sunday Masses including the Italian Mass, so there are plenty of opportunities, and plenty of room for spacing out in accordance with the protocol. At the moment we are still only seeing 30-40 parishioners at each of the English Sunday Masses; many more parishioners can and should be coming, now; so have the confidence to return to your regular Mass. The Lord — and the parish — will be so pleased to see you here at prayer again at the Sacred Mysteries.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFESSION for you to receive forgiveness before Easter will be offered by Fr Joshy & me at extra times before Easter: this week, that will be **Tuesday 6–7pm**, and Friday 11–11.45am. These times will take place during Adoration; Fr Joshy will be in the Lady Chapel; I will be in the Confessional.

May we enter prayerfully into Passiontide recalling the Lord's suffering & sacrifice! Fr Philip



2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 57

In stressing the bond between word and Eucharist, ... I wish to mention the importance of the Lectionary. The reform called for by the Second Vatican Council has borne fruit in a richer access to sacred Scripture, which is now offered in abundance, especially at Sunday Mass. The present structure of the Lectionary not only presents the more important texts of Scripture with some frequency, but also helps us to understand the unity of God's plan thanks to the interplay of the Old and New Testament readings, an interplay "in which Christ is the central figure, commemorated in his paschal mystery."

PRAYER & LITURGY

CHURCH OPENING: c. 8.30am–7pm, with **Adoration** at the beginning and at the end of the day (Mon–Fri). Low-level supervision from volunteer parishioners operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- Parish volunteer stewards ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- *Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.*
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- Confessions available again in the usual confessional, but only kneeling at the grille/curtain, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

YEAR OF ST JOSEPH: Pope Francis declared that 8th Dec 2020–21 is to be a 'Year of St Joseph' – <u>prayer cards</u> are available, and in March, the month of Joseph, extra devotion to him would be very appropriate.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: the "Way of the Cross" is prayed in church each Friday (12.30pm after Mass) & Saturday (9.30am, before Mass). Please note: you will need to remain in your place in the pews and not follow the priest.
