PALM SUNDAY

28th MARCH 2021

Gospel: Mark 15: 1–39 — The Passion according to St Mark.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

PALM SUNDAY, WITH JESUS'S TRIUMPHAL ENTRY, marks the start of these most sacred of Christian days, Holy Week. I urge you to keep this week with all the solemnity that it deserves, and especially through your attendance – if you possibly can, and are not 'shielding' for medical reasons – at the ceremonies in church. All the service times for Holy Week are inside the Newsletter, but the crucial times for the **Sacred Triduum** are:



6pm Holy Thursday Mass; 3pm Good Friday Liturgy; 9pm Holy Saturday (Easter) Vigil


Each of the Triduum services will be simpler than usual, as there is still an expectation that we should be gathering indoors for shorter times rather than longer. Even so, let us give thanks that we *can* celebrate Holy Week together as a Catholic community, unlike last year when Fr Joshy & I celebrated these beautiful rituals alone! Please note: Good Friday, the doors will be closed once we begin the liturgy at 3pm.

PRAYER: think of coming to one or other meditation on the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday (10am or 7pm); and also use my sixth and final Lenten prayer sheet, included with your Newsletter today.

FASTING: this is compulsory for those aged 16–60 on Good Friday, along with abstinence from meat for those aged 14+; this ancient practice of penance allows us to focus on the sacred day of the Lord's Cross.

ALMSGIVING: as well as charities highlighted through Lent, we are asked to give generously for the Holy Places as we attend the rites of Good Friday: this supports the Franciscan friars in the Holy Land as they care for the sites of Our Lord's ministry, and the ancient Catholic communities of Palestine and beyond.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFESSION for you to receive forgiveness before Easter will be offered by Fr Joshy & me at extra times: this week, that will be Monday 6-7pm, and Wednesday 10-11am. These will take place during Adoration; Fr Joshy will be in the Lady Chapel; I will be in the Confessional.



May blessings be poured out upon us all from our crucified Lord! Fr Philip

"The homily 'is part of the liturgical action' and is meant to foster a deeper understanding of the word of God, so that it can bear fruit in the lives of the faithful." The homily is a means of bringing the scriptural message to life in a way that helps the faithful to realize that God's word is present and at work in their everyday lives. It should lead to an understanding of the mystery being celebrated, serve as a summons to mission, and prepare the assembly for the profession of faith, the universal prayer and the Eucharistic liturgy. ... The faithful should be able to perceive clearly that the preacher has a compelling desire to present Christ, who must stand at the centre of every homily.

HOLY WEEK

PALM SUNDAY 28th March: Blessing of Palms will take place at every Mass.

MAUNDY THURSDAY:1st April8.15am Adoration9am Morning Prayer6pm Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper

GOOD FRIDAY: 2nd April

9.45am Morning Prayer10am Stations of the Cross3pm Celebration of the Lord's Passion7pm Stations of the Cross

HOLY SATURDAY: 3rd April 9.45am Morning Prayer 9pm Mass of the Easter Vigil

EASTER SUNDAY: 9.15, 11.15am & 5pm Mass

NOTE: The Triduum ceremonies will be simplified because of the current pandemic protocols: e.g. there will be no washing of the Feet, and no watching in prayer till midnight on Maundy Thursday; and no kissing of the Cross on Good Friday. The Easter Vigil will also be more streamlined.

RECONCILIATION BEFORE EASTER

Fr Philip & Fr Joshy will *both* be available to hear Confessions in church on:

Monday 29th March: 6-7pm Wed 31st March: 10-11am.

Additionally, Fr Philip will be available for Confessions:

Holy Thurs: 9.15am & 5-5.30pm Good Fri: 10.45am, 2pm, 4pm & 6.30pm Holy Sat: 10-11am

CHURCH OPENING: c. 8.30am–7pm, with **Adoration** at the beginning and at the end of the day (Mon–Fri). Low-level supervision from volunteer parishioners operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:

• Parish volunteer stewards ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols

regarding hygiene and distancing.

- *Sunday Mass is shortened,* to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you *exit* the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- *The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended,* so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- *Confessions* available again in the usual confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.
