

Gospel: John 10: 11–18 – The good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.


# My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

**'GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY'** is the name we often give to this Fourth Sunday of Easter, given that we always hear some excerpt from Jn 10, the chapter in which Our Lord describes Himself as "the Good Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep." It is a beautiful image, and we turn to the Lord for His loving guidance, and to bring us back when we stray.

**PART OF OUR TRADITION IS TO KEEP THIS ALSO AS 'VOCATIONS SUNDAY'** and we take the chance to support the seminaries where we train our future priests, through the annual collection. The seminary in London, Allen Hall, has recently issued its <u>Easter 2021 news</u>, as it continues, despite the pandemic, to train our seminarians. The seminary in Rome that I attended, the Venerable English College (<u>https://www.vecrome.org/</u>),

has just announced that a Westminster priest, Fr Stephen Wang, will be its Rector from the autumn, replacing Mgr Philip Whitmore, also of our diocese, who has served as Rector for 8 years. # 2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 68

The *ambo* ... from which the word of God is proclaimed ... should be located in a clearly visible place to which the attention of the faithful will be naturally drawn during the Liturgy of the Word. It should be fixed, and decorated in aesthetic harmony with the *altar*, in order to present visibly the theological significance of *the double table of the word and of the Eucharist*. The readings, the responsorial psalm ... are to be proclaimed from the ambo; it can also be used for the homily and the prayers of the faithful.



#### PRAYER & LITURGY

**CHURCH OPENING:** c. 8.30am–7pm, with **Adoration** at the beginning and at the end of the day (Mon–Fri). Low-level supervision from volunteer parishioners operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

#### **CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:**

- Parish volunteer stewards ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- *Sunday Mass is shortened,* to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you *exit* the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- *Confessions* available again in the usual confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

**YEAR OF ST JOSEPH** declared by Pope Francis (8<sup>th</sup> Dec 2020–21) – <u>prayer cards</u> are available.

ANNUAL MASS OF THANKSGIVING FOR **MATRIMONY:** live-stream from Westminster Cathedral, on Saturday 15th May 2021 at 3.00pm. The Cardinal will be celebrating a livestreamed Mass for all couples in the Diocese who are celebrating their 5th, 10th, 25th, 30th, 40th, 50th and 60th (and every year over 60) wedding anniversary of Catholic marriage in 2021. If you are celebrating an anniversary, please give the following details to the presbytery: husband and wife's names, wedding date, full postal address and email (or telephone number if no email), and these details will be sent to those organizing this celebration. An Order of Service can be downloaded from the Cathedral website before the event - www.westminstercathedral.org.uk.

**MONTH OF OUR LADY**: During May, a decade of the Rosary will be prayed for before each Sunday Mass.

**MAY DEVOTIONS** in presbytery garden at the grotto: **Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> May at 3pm**. You will need to be stationary and spaced out — there won't be a 'procession' as such. Some chairs will be provided for those unable to stand. All welcome.

#### **FINANCE**

**CONTACTLESS GIVING AFTER MASS:** since many people now carry little or no cash on them, beginning this Easter weekend, all being well, there will be a device for giving your weekly offering to the parish for its upkeep contactlessly, by card. You will find the simple device at the LEFT HAND of the exit doors from church as you leave Mass. Please remember to use hand gel sanitizer before and/or after using the device. It seems to be working well.

**NEW BOXES OF OFFERTORY ENVELOPES.** If you would like to start using envelopes, please contact the Presbytery. **Fr Philip & Fr Joshy delivered many of the boxes during Easter week.** If you now have a standing order and don't want your box of envelopes in the future, please contact the presbytery to let us know.

**PARISH FINANCE:** Thank you so much to all who continue to give regularly by S.O., or by envelope throughout this critical time.

#### **CATECHETICS**

"RCIA" / FIRST HOLY COMMUNION / CONFIRMATION: Fr Philip hopes to e-mail the 2020 First-Communion families with some intended plans, this week. Confirmation candidates who have been regularly attending Mass will be invited over the coming months to be confirmed at parish Sunday Masses in groups of 3 or 4.

**BAPTISMS** are likely to be permitted from 17<sup>th</sup> May. If you have completed a Baptism course with Fr Philip *previously*, then you can be in touch with the Presbytery to arrange a tentative Sunday-lunchtime date for your child's baptism. The likely numbers of attendees will be small, perhaps only 15 or 30.

**BAPTISM COURSE**: The next course will be held on **Tuesday 4th May in the crypt & Friday 14th May in the church from 7.30-9pm. Only one parent should attend the course and a face covering should be worn.** The course must be completed before a Baptism can be arranged; to enrol, please contact the presbytery.

**WEDDINGS:** If you intend to get married in the second half of this year, please contact the presbytery as soon as possible so that dates for the next Marriage-Preparation course can be set.

#### **JUSTICE & PEACE & PRO-LIFE**

**CORONAVIRUS – FOODBANK:** Thank you to parishioners who give so generously for the local FoodBank! The need is for hygiene items, toilet paper, sanitary products etc., as well as sealed packages of NON-PERISHABLE foods: dry food, tins, and long-life milk etc. FoodBank collection boxes are in the church porch.

#### SOCIAL & MISCELLANEOUS

**PRIESTS' TRAINING FUND:** this Sunday we pray for priests and for vocations to the

priesthood. **The annual collection for the Priests' Training Fund** helps pay for the priestly formation of men for the Catholic priesthood. There are currently 42 men studying at Allen Hall seminary, 18 of whom are for our own Diocese; and two men are studying in Rome, also for our diocese. Last year three men were ordained to the priesthood for our diocese. The fund also supports the ongoing enrichment and formation of our ordained priests.
