My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,


THE BISHOPS' CONFERENCE OF ENGLAND & WALES, meeting at their Spring gathering after Easter, have written a letter to us, entitled 'The Day of the Lord,' addressing various issues pertaining to the pandemic, and most of all encouraging the Catholics of the country to begin in earnestness their return to regular Sunday practice at Mass. A copy of this letter is enclosed with your Newsletter, and I encourage you to read the stirring words with which our Bishops remind us of the sacred treasure which is the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Jesus truly present in the Eucharist, and our need to be present here with Him.



IN TODAY'S GOSPEL PASSAGE, Our Lord describes Himself as "the True Vine." It's an image that likewise emphasizes the centrality of our being one with Him — present to Him, united with Him — so that we can receive His grace and life. "Apart from Me, you can do nothing," He reminds us! It's a metaphor that is clear and instructive: just as the life flows into the vine only through its being healthy and whole, so the lifeblood of Jesus can only flow into our souls by our being one with Him, and this occurs most

powerfully in our being present with Him at His Sacrifice, as He offers His lifeblood on the altar.

In order to continue safely opening the Church and celebrating Mass, we need the assistance of many volunteer as open-church supervisors and Mass stewards. A valiant force of parishioners has served in these capacities during the past 10 months, for which we should all be extremely grateful. But there are now some gaps in the supervisors' rota which need covering, so I ask that if anyone is available to offer their services, or to return to assisting after a break — even for just one 2-hr slot a week — could you please get in touch soon with Pat Kavanagh who kindly draws up the rota each week: patandcarolkav@btinternet.com. 2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 69

The readings drawn from sacred Scripture may never be replaced by other texts, however significant the latter may be from a spiritual or pastoral standpoint: "No text of spirituality or literature can equal the value and riches contained in sacred Scripture, which is the word of God." This is an ancient rule of the Church which is to be maintained. In the face of certain abuses, Pope John Paul II had already reiterated the importance of never using other readings in place of sacred Scripture. The *Responsorial Psalm* is also the word of God, and hence should not be replaced by other texts.

PRAYER & LITURGY

BANK HOLIDAY MASS on Monday will be at 10am. The church will be closed after Mass.

MONTH OF OUR LADY: During May, a decade of the Rosary will be prayed for before each Sunday Mass.

ASCENSION DAY is on **Thursday 13**th **May** and Mass will be at 9.30am, 12 noon and 6pm.

CHURCH OPENING: c. 8.30am–7pm, with **Adoration** at the beginning and at the end of the day (Mon–Fri). Low-level supervision from volunteer parishioners operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- Parish volunteer stewards ensure that those arriving at Mass adhere to the protocols regarding hygiene and distancing.
- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass continues to be suspended, so those whose health is compromised may still feel it necessary to avoid coming to Mass for the time being.
- Confessions available again in the usual confessional, but only kneeling at the grille/curtain, not face to face. Alternatively, ring Fr Philip for an appointment for confession in the open in the parish garden.

MASS OF **THANKSGIVING FOR MATRIMONY** live-streamed from Westminster Cathedral, Saturday 15th May 2021 at 3.00pm. The Cardinal will be celebrating a Mass for all couples in the Diocese who are celebrating their 5th, 10th, 25th, 30th, 40th, 50th and 60th wedding anniversary of Catholic marriage in 2021. If you are celebrating an anniversary, please give the following details to the presbytery: husband and wife's names, wedding date, full postal address and email (or telephone number if no e-mail), and these details will be sent to those organizing this celebration. MAY DEVOTIONS in presbytery garden at the grotto: **Sunday 23**rd **May at 3pm**. You will need to be stationary and spaced out — there won't be a 'procession' as such. Some chairs will be provided for those unable to stand. All welcome.

HOLY COMMUNION VISITS: Fr Philip hopes to be able to resume his visits to housebound parishioners after 17th May.

FINANCE

CONTACTLESS GIVING AFTER MASS: since many people now carry little or no cash on them, there is now a device for giving your weekly offering to the parish for its upkeep contactlessly, by card. The device at the LEFT HAND of the exit doors from church as you leave Mass. Please remember to use hand gel sanitizer before and/or after using the device. It is simple to use and seems to be working well.

CATECHETICS

"RCIA" / FIRST HOLY COMMUNION / CONFIRMATION: Fr Philip e-mailed the 2020 First-Communion families with some intended plans, last week. Confirmation candidates who have been regularly attending Mass will be invited over the coming months to be confirmed at parish Sunday Masses in groups of 3 or 4.

BAPTISMS are likely to be permitted from 17th May. If you have completed a Baptism course with Fr Philip *previously*, then be in touch with the Presbytery to arrange a tentative Sunday date for your child's baptism. The numbers of attendees will be small, perhaps only 15 or 30.

BAPTISM COURSE will be held on Tues 4th May in crypt & Fri 14th May in the church from 7.30-9pm. Only one parent need attend the course; a face covering should be worn. The course must be completed before a Baptism can be arranged; to enrol, please contact Presbytery.

WEDDINGS: If you intend to get married in the second half of this year, please contact the Presbytery as soon as possible so that dates for

the next Marriage-Preparation course can be set.
