



# 2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 74

An important aspect of the Church's pastoral work which, if used wisely, can help in rediscovering the centrality of God's word is catechesis ... Luke's description of the disciples who meet Jesus on the road to Emmaus represents, in some sense, the model of a catechesis centred on "the explanation of the Scriptures", an explanation which Christ alone can give, as he shows that they are fulfilled in his person. The hope which triumphs over every failure was thus reborn, and made those disciples convinced and credible witnesses of the Risen Lord. ... Here I wish first and foremost to stress that catechesis "must be permeated by the mindset, the spirit and the outlook of the Bible and the Gospels through assiduous contact with the texts themselves; yet it also means

remembering that catechesis will be all the richer and more effective for reading the texts with the mind and the heart of the Church," and for drawing inspiration from the two millennia of the Church's reflection and life.

**WE WELCOME INTO THE CHURCH** Maria Verde who will be baptised this weekend.

**MAY DEVOTIONS**: Due to the bad weather forecast, this will not be held in the garden but IN THE CHURCH this Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 3pm.

**MONTH OF OUR LADY**: a decade of the Rosary will be prayed before each Sunday Mass.

CORPUS CHRISTI (Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> June): because at present it would not be feasible to have the '40 Hours' devotion — owing to the cleaning that still has to take place after each Mass etc. — Fr Philip intends to have a Sunday Holy Hour (Adoration, Evening Prayer & Benediction) on the feast of Corpus Christi, 3.30pm-4.30pm.

**MASS INTENTIONS:** there are many spare weekday & some weekend dates for intentions for you to request Mass in the coming weeks. Mass can be offered not only for the deceased, but also for the intentions of the sick, for special intentions, for thanksgiving etc. Intention can be published as 'Private Intention' if you so wish.

**CHURCH OPENING:** c. 8.30am–7pm, with **Adoration** at the beginning and at the end of the day (Mon–Fri). Low-level supervision from volunteer parishioners operates throughout each day, to ensure that all is safe. There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

#### **CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:**

- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you exit the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- Confessions available again in the usual confessional, but only kneeling at the

grille/curtain, not face to face.

**5PM SUNDAY MASS:** Please note that the 5pm Mass will continue for now, but will cease from August, or sooner if we are allowed to resume using all the pews.

**YEAR OF ST JOSEPH** declared by Pope Francis (8th Dec 2020–21) — <u>prayer cards</u> are available.

**HOLY COMMUNION VISITS**: Fr Philip hopes to be able to resume his visits to housebound parishioners after 17<sup>th</sup> May.

LAUDATO SI': This is the anniversary week of Pope Francis's encyclical, Laudato Si' in 2015. It means "praising God" for the gift of Creation (St Francis of Assisi). We need to care about what is happening to our climate/environment; we have plenty of facts, but we need to think about our values as Catholic Christians.

# **FINANCE**

CONTACTLESS GIVING AFTER MASS: since many people now carry little or no cash on them, there is now a device for giving your weekly offering to the parish for its upkeep contactlessly, by card. The device at the LEFT HAND exit door from church as you leave Mass. It is simple to use and seems to be working well.

# **CATECHETICS**

"RCIA" / FIRST HOLY COMMUNION / CONFIRMATION: Fr Philip has e-mailed the 2020 First-Communion families with the groups and class dates, for the resumed programme last week. 2020 Confirmation candidates who have been regularly attending Mass will be invited over the coming months to be confirmed at parish Sunday Masses in groups of 3 or 4.

**BAPTISMS** are now permitted with up to 30 attendees. If you have completed a Baptism course with Fr Philip *previously*, then be in touch with the Presbytery to arrange a Sunday date for your child's baptism.

BAPTISM COURSE will be held Wed 9th June in the crypt & Fri 18th June in the church, 7.30–9pm. Only one parent need attend the course; a face covering should be worn. The course must be completed before a Baptism can be arranged; to enrol, please contact the Presbytery.

**WEDDINGS:** If you intend to get married in the second half of this year, please contact the Presbytery as soon as possible so that dates for the next Marriage-Preparation course can be set.
