


## **ELEVENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR**

# My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,


THE MONTH OF JUNE IS DEDICATED TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS, and Friday last saw the actual feast of the Sacred Heart. It's a beautiful devotion, which received a special impetus when Our Lord appeared a number of times to St Margaret Mary Alacoque in her convent in Paray-le-Monial in eastern France in the 1670s. By the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century it had become a feast celebrated across the entire Church, and associated with it was the tradition of the 9'First Fridays,' on which we are encouraged to attend Mass. There are many lovely prayers to Jesus, invoking the love of His Sacred Heart, for example, the powerful *Litany to the Sacred Heart of Jesus*: http://www.catholictradition.org/Litanies/litany8.htm

### 2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 84

The laity [have a] generous activity in spreading the Gospel in the various settings of daily life, at work and in the schools, in the family and in education. This responsibility, rooted in Baptism, needs to develop through an ever more conscious Christian way of life capable of "accounting for the hope" within us. In the *Gospel of Matthew*, Jesus points out that "the field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the Kingdom." These words apply especially to the Christian laity, who live out their specific vocation to holiness by a life in the Spirit expressed "in a particular way by their *engagement in temporal matters* and by their *participation in earthly activities.*" The laity need to be trained to discern God's will through a familiarity with his word, read and studied in the Church under the guidance of her legitimate pastors.

**WE WELCOME INTO THE CHURCH** Kane Collins and Blousey Harrison who will be baptised this weekend.

**MASS INTENTIONS:** there are many spare *weekday & some weekend dates* for intentions for you to request Mass in the coming weeks. Mass can be offered not only for the deceased, but also for the intentions of the sick, for special intentions, for thanksgiving etc. Intention can be published as 'Private Intention' if you so wish.

**CHURCH OPENING:** c. 8.15am–7pm, with **Adoration** at the beginning and at the end of the day (Mon–Fri). There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

#### **CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:**

- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you *exit* the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- *Confessions* available again in the usual confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face.

**5PM SUNDAY MASS:** Please note that the 5pm Mass will continue for now, but will cease from August, or sooner if we are allowed to resume using all the pews.

**YEAR OF ST JOSEPH** declared by Pope Francis (8th Dec 2020–21) – prayer cards are available.

#### **CATECHETICS**

### **JUSTICE & PEACE & PRO-LIFE**

THE 'DAY FOR LIFE' is to be held during the weekend of 19th / 20th June. This day, inaugurated by St. John Paul II, presents an opportunity to pray for the gift of life from conception to natural death, to raise awareness of the precious gift of life, and to support the work of protecting life in its most vulnerable stages through the annual collection. This assists prolife organisations who raise awareness, engage in parliamentary work and pastoral outreach. These finds are distributed by the Department of Social Justice of the Bishops' Conference. Against this backdrop of loving care, we are now faced with the very real threat of the legalisation of 'assisted suicide' in our country. It is not a question of 'if' this challenge will come, it is now a question of 'when.' There is now a Private Members Bill in the House of Lords on so-called 'Assisted Dying' and it is only a matter of time before the issue is back in the House of Commons.
