

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR Gospel: Mark 5: 21-43 — Little girl, I tell you to get up.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,


THE GOSPEL OF THIS SUNDAY continues our reading of Mark's Gospel in its early chapters. Today we hear of a double healing — both Jairus's recently-dead daughter, and the woman with chronic bleeding. In all our health concerns, therefore, and indeed our fear of death, we know that Our Lord Jesus can give us relief and can guide us in prayer to accept His will with peacefulness.

TUESDAY IS THE SOLEMN FEAST OF SS PETER & PAUL, foremost of the apostles, and in normal times this would be a *Holy Day of Obligation*. I urge you to come to Mass this Tuesday, to celebrate this great feastday which honours St Peter and St Paul jointly as they both died a martyr's death in Rome: Peter in c. 64AD and Paul in c. 67AD. Their lives, their ministries, and their first-hand witness of Jesus laid the foundations for the early Church — no wonder Emperor Nero knew that to

try and eliminate Christianity he had to get rid of St Peter and St Paul. But in fact their martyrdoms gave even more impetus to the growing Church, and it became a motto for the Church of Rome: *"The blood of martyrs is the seed of the Church."* Let us celebrate the honour of these great saints with our prayerful presence at Mass this Tuesday:

2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 85

The great mystery of marriage is the source of the essential *responsibility of parents towards their children*. Part of authentic parenthood is to pass on and bear witness to the meaning of life in Christ: through their fidelity and the unity of family life, spouses are the first to proclaim God's word to their children. The ecclesial community must support and assist them in fostering family prayer, attentive hearing of the word of God, and knowledge of the Bible. To this end the Synod urged that *every household have its Bible*, to be kept in a worthy place and used for reading and prayer.



PRAYER & LITURGY

CONFIRMATION: We congratulate and pray for Dario Sanzeri who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this weekend:

SAINTS PETER & PAUL'S solemn feast day is Tuesday 29th June and Mass will be at 9.30am, 12 noon and 6pm.

ANGELA MCINTYRE of Osborne Road died recently, aged 91. Her funeral will be held in private. Our sympathies go out to her family. *May she rest in peace.*

NO 6PM ADORATION on Thurs or Friday this week: neither Fr Philip nor Fr Joshy is available.

MASS INTENTIONS: there are many spare *weekday & some weekend dates* for intentions for you to request Mass in the coming weeks. Mass can be offered not only for the deceased, but also for the intentions of the sick, for special intentions, for thanksgiving etc. Intention can be published as 'Private Intention' if you so wish.

CHURCH OPENING: c. 8.15am–7pm, with **Adoration** at the beginning and at the end of the day (Mon–Fri). There are hygienic facilities in place, masks are to be worn, and distancing (2m from any person other than from one's own household) is to be maintained.

CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:

- Sunday Mass is shortened, to give time for sanitizing the church between Masses. There is no congregational singing, no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you *exit* the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- *Confessions* available again in the usual confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face.

5PM SUNDAY MASS: Please note that the 5pm Mass will continue for now, but will cease from August, or sooner if we are allowed to resume using all the pews.

CATECHETICS

RCIA: it would be good to hear from any adult who wishes to think about being Baptized, becoming a Catholic, or being Confirmed if they 'missed out' at a younger age. Do get in touch with Fr Philip, sooner rather than later, so that he can begin to form a group that in the autumn would gather and receive instruction and formation in the Catholic faith with a view to receiving the Sacrament(s) at Easter.

BAPTISMS are permitted with up to 30 attendees. If you have completed a Baptism course with Fr Philip *previously*, then be in touch with the Presbytery to arrange a Sunday date for your child's baptism.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION: 2020 **First-Communion** families whose children are not at St Cross or St Augustine's Primary schools: please endeavour to bring your child to have Confession again with Fr Philip at some point prior to their First-Holy Communion day. (Those at the Catholic schools will have this opportunity during the school day.)
