

# My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,


This is the third Sunday of the five Sundays dedicated in Year B in the year we usually read St Mark's Gospel and now read St John's Gospel. It is all about the Eucharist and what the Eucharist means to the people of their day as well as to us today.

This Sunday's readings demonstrate how our Father draws closer to himself, and through Jesus Christ nourishes and sustains us with the living bread of Eucharist.

In the Gospel, those hostile to Jesus are complaining against him, confused by and misunderstanding his teachings. But, Jesus challenges their criticism directly; he is the one who has come to reveal the Father to them. Jesus teaches that he himself is the true, living bread from heaven; bread from heaven; bread that gives us life forever.

Let us pray this week for an openness to the Lord's tender, nourishing care, especially when we experience times of alienation, self-doubt or despair. We pray to deepen our acknowledgement of our human vulnerability and our utter dependence on God's grace and love. Fr Joshy.

# 2020/21 Year of the Word: Pope Benedict XVI, Verbum Domini, n. 88

The faithful [are] encouraged to pray the *Angelus*. This prayer, simple yet profound, allows us "to commemorate daily the mystery of the Incarnate Word." It is only right that the People of God, families and communities of consecrated persons, be faithful to this Marian prayer traditionally recited at sunrise, midday and sunset. In the *Angelus* we ask God to grant that, through Mary's intercession, we may imitate her in doing his will and in welcoming his word into our lives. This practice can help us to grow in an authentic love for the mystery of the incarnation. The ancient prayers of the Christian East which contemplate the entire history of salvation in the light of the *Theotokos*, the Mother of God, are likewise worthy of being known, appreciated and widely used. ... In particular, the venerable *Akathist* hymn to the Mother of God ... represents one of the

highest expressions of the Marian piety of the Byzantine tradition. Praying with these words opens wide the heart and disposes it to the peace that is from above, from God, to that peace which is Christ himself, born of Mary for our salvation.



#### PRAYER & LITURGY

MASS will not take place on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> August and there will no Adoration in the morning or evening. There will also be no evening Adoration on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> August.

SUNDAY HOLY HOUR (Adoration, Evening Prayer & Benediction) will take place at **5pm on** Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> August.

**URGENT! MASS INTENTIONS:** there are very many spare *weekday* & *some weekend dates* for intentions for you to request Mass in the coming weeks. Mass can be offered not only for the deceased, but also for the intentions of the sick, for special intentions, for thanksgiving etc. Intention can be published as 'Private Intention' if you so wish.

#### **CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC MASS:**

- There *can* now be congregational singing, but we will continue with no Offertory Procession and no Sign of Peace for now. Holy Communion will be distributed carefully and slowly. You can give your usual weekly donation as you *exit* the church, rather than in the middle of Mass.
- Please note that the toilets will remain CLOSED.
- *Confessions* available again in the usual confessional, but only *kneeling at the grille/curtain*, not face to face.

**YEAR OF ST JOSEPH** declared by Pope Francis (8<sup>th</sup> Dec 2020–21) – <u>prayer cards</u> are available.
