Gospel: Mark 8: 27-35 You are the Christ. The Son of Man is destined to suffer grievously.

It today's Gospel, Jesus asks the disciples who do people say that I am. They offer various opinions on the basis of hearsay. Then, Jesus asks Peter 'but who do you say that I am?' Peter acknowledges him as the long awaited Messiah the Son of God. That same question which Jesus asks of Peter he asks of us. It is the most important question that you and I have to answer. Who do I say that Jesus is? It will be no good giving a second-hand opinion offered by others, whether they be a member of

our family, a friend, or someone else, or indeed a sponsor in our baptism. We have to make the answer ourselves.

In one sense, the way in which we answer the question will be conditioned by asking ourselves the question, 'who am I?' This is one of the great questions of life. Who am I, why am I here, what is life all about, where am I going? A psychologist once said, 'I am not who I think I am, I am not what other people think I am, I am what I think other people think I am.' This is very perceptive. Apart from Jesus, who could see through human nature and was not deterred by what others thought of him, the way in which we look at ourselves and others is fashioned by the ways in which we think others perceive us. Words which others have spoken about us, hearsay or not, help to form opinions about who we are and our outlook on the world. Science has shown that even words spoken when children are in the womb can have a positive or negative impact upon our development. Family, education, environment, the events of life playing upon our senses can all influence our mental pictures of ourselves, and from a Christian point of view, our spiritual barometer. At the same time, the spiritual state of our hearts, which Jeremiah reminds us is desperately corrupt, makes us see the world with diseased eyes. Is there an answer? Yes. In spite of all this we need to remember that we are infinitely loved by God, whatever and that he calls us to a radical conversion of the ways in which we see ourselves and others, by submitting ourselves to the judgement of the cross and the furnace of his refining love. So who am I? I am not who I think I am, I am not what others think I am, I am not what I think others think I am, but I am a child of Christ, eternally loved who as St Peter reminds us, has 'called you out of darkness into his marvellous light.
