

Gospel: Mark 10: 35-45

The Son of Man came to give his life as a ransom for many.

As Christians, you would like to think that we are good at listening, but sometimes we don't like to hear what is being said. True listening demands a good deal of personal interaction. It doesn't sit well with wandering lonely like a cloud, or blissful solitude, although as a starter we might reflect with Wordsworth upon the beauty of the host of daffodils. True listening involves the gift of our whole selves and because of that attunes us to what it is to be truly human and made in God's image. It shouldn't surprise us therefore that Pope



Francis is reminding us that the process of listening is at the heart of becoming more like the new men and women in Christ which is our vocation. The Pope is calling the entire Catholic Church to a process of intensive listening. That is the whole Church, not just those in leadership positions, but every baptised member. Feedback from the listening process will be gathered and fed into a global synod of bishops to be held in 2023. Perhaps the listening process might be called the synod before the synod. Pope Francis wants a synodal Church which in announcing the gospel, 'journeys together.' Fundamental to the process are two questions to be answered by every parish across the world. How is this 'journeying together' happening here and now in this parish, and what steps does the Spirit ask us to take in order to grow in our journeying together? It goes without saying, that true listening is a spiritual process, and what the Spirit wants is paramount, but whether we will ultimately listen will depend upon our desire to become more like Christ, for the Spirit always glorifies Christ not man. It will also depend upon having an attitude similar to Mary of Bethany in listening to Jesus' every word......'she has chosen the better part which will not be taken away'.....the same Lord who in his Word says to us' listen he who has ears to hear'.
