Gospel: Matthew 5: 1-12

Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.

In many great houses there used to be a long gallery where portraits of the ancestors were displayed often in chronological order. Their faces reminded the current owners that the present generation were a mere episode in a much bigger story, and that the family firm and its fortunes stretched back well into the past. Tomorrow is All Saints Day, the day when we, the Church, especially remember some of our past family members, those whom we recognise as saints. However, our remembrance is not like a long gallery of portraits frozen in time, even as we recall the saints of past generations. Rather, All Saints is a celebration of those



not dead, but alive in Christ, and that with them we already participate in the victory of our Lord. They gave glory to Christ in the manner of their living and dying, and they continue to give Him glory in the heavenly place. After the Spirit, they are our family, not were our family, and we bear the unmistakable likeness of their being. They are not locked in some linear perspective, a heavenly long gallery, where the earliest in time are furthest from the most recently deceased. They gloriously intermingle and have a heavenly equality about them because like the One whom they worship they transcend time, space and its constraints. We boldly affirm the intercession of the saints and their communion with us across the dimensions. They surround us as in an amphitheatre or a stadium, completely enveloping us with their prayers and love, interceding for us to complete the mission of glorying God on earth. Like us, they await the consummation of all things when they will receive a new glorified body, but unlike us, they participate in the worship of heaven to a far greater degree than whatever we can at present. What we can only imagine, they see, hear and conceive. No eye has seen, no ear heard, no heart conceived what God has in store for those who love him. But, out of his great love for us in the feast of his victory, our Lord allows us to be swept up in the worship of the heavenly Jerusalem, worshipping in communion with the great multitude that no one can count....the spirits of those made perfect who eternally acclaim the salvation of God and of the Lamb.

FEAST OF THE WEEK ALL SAINTS 31* OCTOBER

In the early days the Christians were accustomed to solemnize the anniversary of a martyr's death for Christ at the place of martyrdom. Frequently groups of martyrs suffered on the same day, which naturally led to a joint commemoration. In the persecution of Diocletian, the number of martyrs became so great that a separate day could not be assigned to each. But the Church, feeling that every martyr should be venerated, appointed a common day for all. At first only martyrs and St. John the Baptist were honoured by a special day. Other saints were added gradually, and increased in number when a regular process of canonization was established.
