Gospel: Mark 12: 38-44

This poor widow has put in more than all.

There are many ways in which we can support the parish. One of the questions in our November questionnaire is an invitation to think what gifts and talents we have which could be used in the service of the Church. Why not mention them? It could be precisely what the Holy Spirit has laid on your heart and may be exactly what is needed. We tend to underestimate natural gifts.....thinking that they are not spiritual gifts, but simply acknowledging that they could be used for God's greater purpose and glory magnifies the offering. It may be a particular skill which you could offer to train others, allowing them to encounter for the first time the reality of



God's kingdom values of sharing and the sacredness of everyday activity. The Church has always enabled the world to see that behind all things is God's generous creativity. Recognising that we are not self-made but that everything that we have is a gift....'all things come from Thee O Lord, and of thine own do we give Thee'.....releases us into great blessings. God honours those who honour him. To honour him is to recognise that he deserves the very best we can give.....the first fruits. Our cost is to give the very best we can as an act of adoration. What are the first fruits in our lives which we are expending and offering to God? He has given us everything in Jesus Christ. St Paul reminds us that he who has given everything for us will not withhold anything from us. The treasury of heaven is open. Do we respond with generous hearts and lives? Are we a generous people? Taking a financial indicator, we might examine whether financially our giving has kept up with inflation over the last twenty years. This is relevant for those of us who can support the mission of the Church financially and who are in a comfortable position to do so, which is not the lot of everyone at this time. Are we still giving what we gave when we started earning? How much does our financial offering to the Church weigh against the cost of a coffee or a magazine? Does our collective income reflect our overheads and expenditure as a church? It is said the last place to be converted is our pockets. Bearing this in mind, as we count our pennies let us also count our blessings.
