

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT


Gospel: Luke 3: 10-18 What must we do?

Jesus could not have been given a name other than that which Mary and his adopted father were told he had to be given. You must call him Jesus...because he will save his people from their sins. The answer then is in Jesus' name. It comes from the Hebrew Yeshua which means the one who sets free. As St Peter proclaimed ...' there is no other name under heaven, given to men, whereby we must be saved'. Jesus has won for us our liberation and freedom from the deadly poison of sin through his singular act of self-sacrifice upon the cross. Only through this is a new humanity fashioned. The pervasiveness of sin within us and without us continually

mars and contaminates human endeavour. No person, no culture, no philosophy, no religion can resolve it...only Jesus Christ through the saving power of the cross has. If Jesus has set us free from for our sins, then why do we still need to seek forgiveness for them through confession? The answer is that confession is the way in which we access the benefits of saving grace in our lives. Once we are attuned to the voice of our conscience informing us that we have sinned then we need to acknowledge what we have done and say sorry to our Heavenly Father. The door to personal confession is available to us at any time. Like the prodigal son we can always return to our Heavenly Father. More difficult is where we are prompted to uncover our burdens to a priest in what is known as auricular (meaning 'by ear') confession through the sacrament of reconciliation. Telling another person our sin can be very humbling, but we are assured that immense benefits come from it as Jesus has commanded his disciples to confess their sins to one another. So no problem you say, but where does Jesus mention making our confession specially to a priest. He doesn't in so many words but what he does say is that the apostles have the right to forgive sins. The priestly commission is simply the sharing in this apostolic commission. And where we don't seem to have unburdening of our souls through a simple personal private confession, which will be the case where we have committed a more serious 'mortal' sin, then the sacrament of reconciliation accesses for us the wonderful freedom of being reconciled with the Father who loves us, reconciled with the family to which we belong and reconciled with our divided selves. Confession is a wonderful gift so let's not reject it. Let us lay claim to the freedom that Christ has won for us. Fr Julian
