Gospel: John 1: 1-18

The Word was made flesh, and lived among us.

Have yourself a merry, merry Christmas or have yourself a merry, selfish Christmas. These are the only two options. Here's some ingredients for a healthy Christmas.

First adore Jesus who is the reason for the season. The lights, the evergreen, the gifts all point to him. Our scandalous claim is that God has entered our world to set us free. God is love, and yet so often we are not loving, showing that our fundamental human need is to be loved. Through Jesus we are loved back into being. His life for ours....he was born to die so that we might live and love. It is to

those who receive him, and believe in His name that he gives power.

Second, take time to enjoy the twelve days of Christmas and not one. Celebrating Jesus' birthday over twelve days is a good way of reminding ourselves that he wants to be at the centre of every day of our life and not just one. It's also a good way of transitioning into the New Year.

Third let's surrender each day and its daily activity to God, so that these become positively holy days, not just holidays. Let's offer up everything as an act of thanksgiving. We are called to worship and that means not just within four walls but with every fibre of our being, wherever and whatever.

Fourth, as we celebrate God's abundant provision, let's not overindulge because if you do you will kill the true meaning of Christmas and probably yourself. Remember that we are 'fed' in more ways than one not by gulping but by savouring. Take time. Taste life.

Fifth. Let's welcome a change of vision. The humble birth of Jesus reminds us that in what is small, weak, vulnerable, poor we find hidden signs of grace. Let's stop pretending we are something we are not.

Sixth, the news that the angels proclaimed was good news for everyone. The two offspring hiding behind the cloak of Christmas present in Dicken's Christmas Carol were ignorance and want. They exist today. Ignorance is a failure to face up to the reality of ourselves, the world around us and the love of God. Want is the desperate need of the human family to access the shared benefits of God's creation and recreation. What a mission for the people of God as we approach a new year.

Happy Christmas! Rejoice the Saviour is here!
