Gospel: Luke 3: 1-6

All mankind shall see the salvation of God.

We are in the last four weeks before Christmas, the season known as Advent. Advent means towards the coming, in other words looking forward to the coming of Jesus. One can meaningfully speak of six Advents. First there is the Advent of Jesus' first coming, as the long expected one and the one whose coming was heralded in the words of prophecy and by the birth of his relative John the Baptist. God so loved the world....... that he sent his Son into the world (John 3:16-17). Then we have the second Advent, as Jesus enters upon his public ministry, heralded again as we



see in the readings today, by the prophetic ministry of John the Baptist. Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world (John 1:29). The third Advent comes to everyone who acknowledges the saving work and Lordship of Jesus Christ and invites him into their lives. He comes seeking admission into our lives. He never forces his way in, but he impresses upon us his desire to set up home with us. If anyone loves me, he will obey my teaching. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. (John 14: 23). The fourth Advent is like a knocking on the door of our souls for a deeper relationship. Behold I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him, and he with me (Revelation 3: 20). These words are often meaningfully used as an invitation for those who do not yet believe to invite Jesus into their lives, but let's not forget that the Lord spoke them not to non- believers but to Christians in first century Laodicea inviting them into a far deeper relationship with Jesus than what they already experienced. Jesus is not content in being a casual visitor or an ignored resident. He is not here to squat. The fifth Advent is when Jesus comes to us in generally unexpected encounters when we recognise that he is to be found in those who bear his image, marred though that is, that we meet anytime of the day. The sixth Advent is the crown of all these other Advents and the one which Jesus spoke most about. It is when he returns not as a child but as King to inaugurate His kingdom and the Bridegroom to vindicate all who have loved him- his Bride the Church. This will be the end of our history, when all will know that it is His Story and the inauguration of a new heaven and new earth. Behold I am coming soon!...I am the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End. ... Amen Come Lord Jesus! (Revelation 22: 12-13,20) Fr Julian
