Gospel: John 2: 1-11

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee.

We are back in so called Ordinary Time in Church's calendar. It's part of the year that falls between the major festivals. It's a strange word because from a Christian perspective no time is ordinary. We live in extraordinary times and it's not because of covid. If the event we have been celebrating has meaning for us ...the coming of Christ in the flesh... then nothing can



ever be ordinary again. The open invitation to every human being to enter into a dynamic relationship with the Creator has been issued. St John is so eager to tell us about it that he doesn't wait until after the Resurrection, but announces it at the very beginning of his gospel, and roots it in the Divine Word communicating and dwelling among us. The consequences of accepting the invitation could not be more significant'to all who received him, who believed in his name he gave the power to become children of God'. In the mass readings for each day we will hear of God's loving purposes and promises, and come face to face with the Divine Word himself .. Jesus.. who will convict us of our need to turn back to the Father and enter into the most incredible relationship conceivable through accepting the good news of His Kingdom. Moreover, the Baptist has already announced Jesus as the sacrifice who will put the cosmos to right because he takes away the sins of the world, and immerse us in the Holy Spirit so that we can live the life of heaven here and now. Do whatever he tells you, our Mother tells the hosts at the wedding at Cana. Even today, even now, if we are prepared to do what he is telling us to do, we would see extraordinary things. And if he can change water into wine, how much more can he change wine into His Precious Blood.
