

Gospel: Luke 4: 21-30

Like Elijah and Elisha, Jesus is not sent to the Jews only.

I'm writing this on Holocaust Memorial Day when we remember the massacre of 6 million Jews by Hitler. They were not the only ones massacred by the Nazis. Many Christians including Catholic priests and religious lost their lives, as well as others who were considered misfits in the plan to create a pure Aryan race. The Day also recalls other more recent genocides, such as occurred in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia, and the Sudan. When we consider that those who died laughed, loved and lived like myself I have to ask the question how would I have responded in the face of these evils and what does being human mean? Am I as loving as I should be to those who are different.? Do I love the other as my neighbour? Do I love as Jesus loves? Under what circumstances might I withdraw from another that love which being made in God's image demands that I give? The Holocaust revealed a fault-line underlying



Western civilization. Outwardly healthy, inwardly it was fatally diseased, not least with antisemitic tendencies which people of faith had engendered over the centuries. How was it that a continent so immersed in Christian values did not prevent the rise of Nazism but actively collaborated with it? Does it reveal a more endemic problem? Can my faith become so domesticated and hedged that it doesn't bring into judgement the claims of the wider world? Being a disciple of Jesus means that I must subject the claims of the secular state to critical analysis and that I must faithfully resist the enticement of any poisonous culture or ideology. The events of Nazareth today remind us that it is all too easy for well-meaning people of faith not to love the stranger who enters our community but even hold the one with whom we claim familiarity in contempt.
