Gospel: Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22

While Jesus after his own baptism was at prayer, heaven opened.

Today is the Baptism of the Lord when we remember Jesus' baptism in the Jordan and it suitably comes shortly after our celebration of the Epiphany, a feast to which it is intimately related. Both are about revealing Jesus to the world, manifesting his credentials as the Christ. On the Epiphany Jesus is revealed as the anointed Messiah not just for the Jewish people but for all the nations. At Jesus' baptism, John the Baptist draws attention to Jesus' saving work, and that his ministry would be that of the anointed one (the Christ) who will baptise his followers in the Holy Spirit. I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who



is more powerful than I am ...he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire'. Reinforcing this is the voice of God declaring that Jesus is His beloved Son upon whom His favour rests. If this were not enough at Epiphany the Eastern Church celebrated a third manifestation of Jesus as the Christ, his changing of the water into wine at the marriage of Cana and the first of Jesus' messianic signs after he embarked upon his public ministry. These three historical events show that Jesus was acknowledged as the Christ from the first and not just after the Resurrection. Moreover, at his nativity the shepherds were told that a Saviour (Jesus) has been born to them who is (note not will be) Christ the Lord. Why is this important? Because there are some today, as in New Testament times, who would wish to drive a wedge between the historical Jesus and the Christ of faith, suggesting that you can believe in Christ without accepting the historicity of his birth and miraculous life. This is a very old heresy draped in modern clothes. Reject it! We cannot pick and choose the biblical account, for if we do this, we are believing in a Christ of our own imagination and not the Lord and Saviour who was born and lived among us, and who gave His flesh for the life of the world.
