

Year C SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

13TH FEBRUARY 2022

Gospel: Luke 6: 17, 20-26

How happy are you who are poor. Alas for you who are rich.

We shall be starting our next First Holy Communion sessions today and our resuming next week current Confirmation sessions. As if to underline that communion and confirmation are about what we do together, we are inviting members of the congregation to pray for the candidates and their families, by adopting a name or names. To lift them up in prayer at least twice a day would be suitable. Our young people as well as their families need our prayers. There are many distractions to following the



Christian path...not least the prevailing culture which can be hostile towards swimming against the tide. That culture also likes to divide off spirituality from religion, as if to say that you can be privately spiritual without being publicly religious. This is a contradiction from a Christian point of view. A private faith or spirituality will lead you only into navel gazing and spiritual darkness. We are fed by the Lord and receive the life of the Spirit in our coming together to celebrate the sacraments. Sunday activities can be socially important, but they can never be as important as attending Mass. We have to ask ourselves the question if I can't turn up for Mass every week (here or wherever, granted that sickness or frailty may prevent it) then can I realistically call myself a Catholic or be seriously committed about my faith? Faith grows as we are built together as the body of Christ. Some will respond that we can worship God outside the four walls of the church. True we can, and we always should, but that doesn't excuse the fact that Jesus himself set us the practice of turning up at the house of prayer every week, while he expected his disciples after his Resurrection to meet together to worship him in the 'breaking of the bread', and that was quickly established on the first day of the week. If we have a problem with what Mother Church expects, let us recall that it was not the Church but Jesus who commanded us to 'do this in remembrance of me'. A gentle reminder also to us all. How can we expect our young people to grow in faith if we ourselves are not prepared to grow and encourage them by our example?

CHILDREN'S LITURGY HELPERS NEEDED at the 9.15am Mass. If you are available to assist, please do contact the presbytery.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR: Gabby will be starting a Children's Choir at the 9.15am Mass on Sunday mornings. Please ensure that your child arrives at church at 9am and goes straight to the organ loft, so there will be time to run through the hymns before Mass.

LENT

ASH WEDNESDAY is on 2nd March and Mass will be at 9.30am, 12 noon and 8pm. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting (for those aged 16-60) and abstinence (for those aged 14+). This means that we consciously choose to eat less – one main meal only – and that (as on all Fridays) we eat no meat whatsoever.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: If anyone is interested in leading the Stations during Lent, please do contact the presbytery.

FRIDAY LUNCHES: During Lent, we would like to serve a simple lunch of soup & a roll on a Friday after Mass in the crypt. Each week the funds raised will be donated to a different charity. If you are interested in making the soup, & helping serve it on 4th, 11th, 18th & 25th March, 1st, & 8th April, please do contact the presbytery.

FINANCE

CONTACTLESS GIVING AT MASS: since many people now carry little or no cash on them, there is now a device for giving your weekly offering to the parish for its upkeep contactlessly, by card. The device is at the LEFT HAND exit door from church as you leave Mass. We have now resumed having the offertory collection during Mass.

PLANNED GIVING ENVELOPES: We are now preparing to issue new sets of offertory envelopes. If you no longer use your envelopes or would like to move to a standing order, please contact the presbytery. Thank you.

GIFT AID: why not help the parish by gift-aiding your weekly offertory donation? Many parishioners have already signed Gift-Aid forms which enables the parish to collect the tax on the donations they make through envelopes or standing orders. There is no further cost to the donor, but the parish is able to claim another £1 for every £4 donated under Gift Aid. If you are **able to sign a Gift-Aid form, there are some on the notice board at the back of church, or you can contact the presbytery.** You do need to be a UK taxpayer to sign a form.
