Gospel: Luke 6: 39-45

A man's words flow out of what fills his heart.

I was going to write about Ash Wednesday but with the unfolding of events in Eastern Europe something should be said about that. If as is likely, Ukraine will fall, then neighbouring countries could be brought into the conflict and we would be on the brink of a Third World War. Let us say that the Russian invasion of Ukraine is an evil act of aggression without any justification in international law. Putin has denied the right of Ukraine to selfdetermination and existence. This is contrary to the biblical understanding of nationhood where the



nations of the world will be brought into obedience not to a Russian dictatorship but to worship the King of Kings. This means that the progression of all nations to self-determination, independence and nationhood is inevitable. Moreover, Our Lady, when she appeared at Ukraine in 1914, prophesied the independence of Ukraine after eighty years. This was before her appearance at Fatima where the little shepherds were told that the errors of Russia would bring disaster to the world. The years of atheistic communism, and its export to the rest of the world have borne this out. Mercifully with the collapse of the Soviet empire, Russia has returned to the faith, but as we have seen its leaders are far from her immaculate heart and the overtures of the Queen of Peace. Many people will be at a loss as to how to pray so here are some simple suggestions.

Pray for Putin that he would be healed of whatever that has made him into a lesser man, and that he would repent of his evil. Pray for his administration that it would be divided and collapse

Pray for the Russian Orthodox Church that our brothers and sisters in the faith, and especially those in leadership, would speak truth to power, and not shield behind the hypocrisy that evil cannot be named or that the actions of a government are above reproach.

Call upon the intercession of the saints of the Ukraine, and especially the support of St Andrew who took the gospel to the banks of the Dnieper and St Barbara whose relics are held in the country.

Call upon the intercession of St Michael on behalf of the city and the country. It is St Michael's Monastery which stands in the heart of Kiyv and whose rebuilding in the 1990s after its destruction by the Soviets in the 1930s has been a sign of the resurgence of Ukraine: 'Saint Michael Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil; may God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

Finally, pray for repentance and that God's kingdom will come and his will be done.

Exposition will take place at 9am on Saturday mornings in Lent.
