

Gospel: Luke 5: 1-11

They left everything and followed him.

One of my treasured memories is of swimming in the Sea of Galilee early on a mild January morning. It was still dark. No fishermen in sight, nor anyone else for that matter, I went down to the shore behind the kibbutz where I was staying and took the plunge. The biblical scenes as Jesus called and taught his first disciples rushed into my mind. I wondered how it had been for them. Their trade may have been quite profitable, little family firms seeking to meet the hungry needs of the burgeoning local population. When we try and visualise past landscapes we usually have to 'see' behind what later centuries have laid over them. With the Sea of Galilee, we have to do the opposite. In Peter's day it was heavily populated, much more than now, with many centres of population along its shores. Galilee of the Gentiles, it drew people from far and wide. In many respects it was an ideal base for launching the good news. There was something in the local profession of fisherman which



made it ideally suited to mission. Of course, that doesn't mean that all fishermen would make good missionaries. Not all the first apostles were fishermen. Moreover, Peter and his colleagues had first to become disciples, prepared to follow and learn from the master fisherman, before Jesus could use them further. Their first learning curve was to recognise that they were beaten at their own profession. Able fisherman as Peter was, Jesus showed him that he was better. He is the expert fisherman, just as he is the expert anything else. How different our work would be if we invited him into our daily routines and work. He may call us to leave that and invite us to use and develop the skills and talents which he has given us in a more direct apostolate. For most of us he will call us to witness to the gospel in the profession, in the family and context in which we are set. Crucially no one is self-made in the kingdom of God. As St Matthew reminds us in his gospel, Jesus says I will make you fishers of men. In the kingdom of God we do not make ourselves. Are we prepared for a make-over??

COVID UPDATE: Following the announcement by the government that "Plan B" measures have been lifted, the following guidance is offered:

FINANCE

CONTACTLESS GIVING AT MASS: since many people now carry little or no cash on them, there is now a device for giving your weekly offering to the parish for its upkeep contactlessly, by card. The device is at the LEFT HAND exit door from church as you leave Mass. We have now resumed having the offertory collection during Mass.

PLANNED GIVING ENVELOPES: We are now preparing to issue new sets of offertory envelopes. If you no longer use your envelopes or would like to move to a standing order, please contact the presbytery. Thank you.

GIFT AID: why not help the parish by gift-aiding your weekly offertory donation? Many parishioners have already signed Gift-Aid forms which enables the parish to collect the tax on the donations they make through envelopes or standing orders. There is no further cost to the donor, but the parish is able to claim another £1 for every £4 donated under Gift Aid. If you are able to sign a Gift-Aid form, there are some on the notice board at the back of church, or you can contact the presbytery. You do need to be a UK taxpayer to sign a form.
