SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT Gospel: Luke 9: 28-36

As Jesus prayed, the aspect of his face was changed.

In 987 the people of the Ukraine were baptised in the Dnieper river following the conversion of their ruler Vladimir. There were many issues which caused the prince to adopt the Christian faith but one of the most important was the report which he received from his envoys when they encountered Byzantine Christianity at Constantinople...'we no longer knew whether we were in heaven or on earth...nor such beauty as we know not how to tell it'. The three disciples must have felt the same as they experienced the events of the Transfiguration our gospel reading for today. The destination is in sight and it is infinitely greater than anything that we could comprehend or describe. It is not resurrection as important as that is, but rather one of inexpressible glory. Jesus' appearance changed. Both his face and his clothing. Luke described his clothing as brilliant as lightning. Mark that no bleach on earth could make them more brilliant. No one in scripture is similarly described apart from Mary in Revelation, where our Mother is seen as clothed with the sun and the moon at her feet. That



also was an incredibly brilliant sight for who could look into the face of the sun? But notice the difference, Mary's clothing is created light, whereas the light of Jesus comes from within himself. St John is the only gospel which doesn't mention the event which is remarkable given that he so often highlights light. However, we might say that the whole of his gospel is about Transfiguration... how Jesus the Light of the world reveals the glory of his light through his birth, ministry, death and resurrection. The theme of divine light, as of the centrality of the Transfiguration, is central to all expressions of Eastern Christianity. Iconographers will first study the Transfiguration because it speaks so powerfully of light. Icons have no shadows because the artist is not trying to depict created natural light but the uncreated light of glory. The skies over Ukraine are sullied by the fires of war. As our Ukrainian Catholic and Orthodox brothers and sisters face the onslaught of a living hell, may they know that their glory is assured through Christ Transfigured.
