FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT 27TH MARCH 2022

Gospel: Luke 15: 1-3, 11-32

Your brother here was dead and has come to life.

Today's gospel reading is the story of the Prodigal Son, but that's somewhat misleading for it's really a story about two sons. The younger son rejects his father and his family, goes off to squanders his money, falls upon hard times and returns to his father full of repentance. A relationship that is broken is restored. The problem with the second son is that his words and actions reveal that he never knew that he had a treasured position or

relationship in the first place. He uses no respectful words for his father....'this son of yours...and loathes him for his generosity and mercy'. He recognises no familial ties with his brother. Being a member of the family means nothing to him. Friends not family were important to him...'my friends'. Finally, his relationship with his father is not one of sonship but of slavery...'all these years I have slaved for you'. The story of the prodigal son is a powerful parable without the appearance of the second son, so why did Jesus mention the second son? The context is important. Before Jesus told the parable, the religious leaders had criticised him for welcoming sinners. It is not coincidental therefore that the very word presbuteros used for the elder (son) is the same word which was used for the religious elders of the day. It's a classic case where Jesus turns the table on his opponents by showing that they were in a more desperate state than the prodigals and sinners who welcomed his message of grace. There is only one Gospel, that of mercy and grace. We cannot condition whether people repent but we must welcome one another regardless. 'This man' they said' welcomes sinners and eats with them'. There is something of the second son in each and every one of us. Sometimes wallowing in self-pity... not recognising that our soul is in a more desperate state than the other we judge...not acknowledging that we are sons and daughters of the kingdom... not recognising God as our Loving Heavenly Father... not seeing the family of the Church.... and sometimes enslaved to the disordered affections of the world than truly free with the Spirit of the children of God.
