

Gospel: John 20: 19-31

Eight days later, Jesus came.

St John Paul II declared that this Sunday would be known also as Divine Mercy Sunday because Easter is all about divine mercy. The collect of the day suitably reminds us of God's everlasting mercy. Of course, divine mercy was there before the first Easter. It is indeed everlasting. Holy Scripture shows the loving faithfulness and mercy of God in his dealings with his unfaithful people. The difference now is that through the sacrificial death of Jesus, the same divine mercy is available for the whole world. This is seen in our gospel today where Jesus sends out his disciples into the world as instruments of mercy with the authority to forgive sins. This forgiveness comes directly from the shed blood of Christ. Leviticus says there is no forgiveness of sins without the shedding of blood. But isn't this more Good Friday than Easter Sunday you might say? Why should we be looking three days back instead of rejoicing at the empty tomb. The truth is that you cannot separate Good Friday and Easter Sunday. There is no glory without the cross. The

Resurrection points to what Christ did on the Cross. Consider what Jesus says and does when he meets his disciples. He points them to the passages in scripture which prophesy his passion. He shows them his wounds. One of the most remarkable things about Jesus' glorified body is that his wounds can be seen and touched. You would expect a glorified body to be totally healed of its affliction but no, Jesus' body was still marked with his wounds. It is essential that he carries these with him into heaven and when he returns he will still bear them. These wounds which we inflicted upon him are the trophies of our freedom. There would be no salvation without them. St Faustina Kowalska, the apostle of divine mercy, correctly teaches that it is for the sake of Jesus' sorrowful passion that we and the whole world can know mercy. His gift and his offering was total so that we can appeal to the entirety of Jesus' sacrifice... his body, blood, soul and divinity as the answer to the problem of our sins and for the sins of the whole world. The Feast of Divine Mercy draws us back to basics. The revelation granted to St Faustina couldn't be more timely. The Lord said, 'Let all mankind recognize My unfathomable mercy. It is a sign for the end times; after it will come the day of justice...Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My Mercy'. The divine floodgates and the fountain of life are still available for the foulest sinner, who repents and places their trust in Jesus.
