FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

3RD APRIL 2022

Gospel: John 8: 1-11

If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her.

St Paul says something remarkable in our epistle today which shows how thoroughly fleshed out was his faith. 'All I want is to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead'. How can we share the sufferings of Christ? There will be the obvious suffering that comes from putting Christ first, being obedient to what he says and running the gauntlet of the world, the flesh and the devil. But what about the sufferings

that come our way, whose provenance is sometimes difficult to discern...a mortal illness, an inexplicable disaster, the surprising event, creation seemingly denied, contradiction of hope. Christian tradition invites us to offer up all such suffering sacrificially so that through them we can draw closer to Christ. While it is easier to offer up our own suffering rather than to see the suffering of those around us, it may help if we see the general suffering of the world in light of Jesus' incarnation.....his becoming one of us. If we believe that he enters fully into what it is to be human, then the suffering of humanity is an essential aspect of that. Throughout lent we have been invited to walk his Via Dolorosa through realigned priorities and by attuning ourselves to the God's kingdom agenda. Walking the stations in church is a poignant way of focusing upon that agenda, confronting our wayward wills and realigning our hearts. The suffering of the world is the essential filter through which the stations take on added poignancy. This year Ukraine looms large. Jesus is condemned to death among the Ukrainians whose very right to exist is denied and whose freedom is withdrawn. He accepts his cross with those who enter into this time of unavoidable affliction. His falling three times is like the scorched earth policy inflicted on Mariupol, Kharkiv and Kherson. His meeting with his mother is like the balm which the Ukrainian people draw from their devotion to the Virgin. Simon of Cyrene and Veronica are like all those outsiders and those insiders who help to ease the suffering of Christ among the people. The women of Jerusalem are like the mothers and their children mourning Christ in the plight of their husbands. Jesus is stripped in the denuding of the people of their dignity to life and essential protections. Jesus is nailed in the relentless and merciless showering of the missiles, and crucified in a million hatreds that war elicits. Jesus dies on the cross in the killing of everyone whose blood is spilt. Jesus is taken down from the cross in those who are powerless to resist. Jesus is laid in the sepulchre among so many without a grave, but who have died with the hope of better days in their hearts. Jesus walks the stations of his cross in many guises.... Fr Julian
