

Gospel: John 21: 1-19

Jesus stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish.

In our second reading from the last book of the bible, the Apocalypse speaks to us profoundly about ecological equilibrium. Heaven and earth impinge upon each other regardless of whether we are aware of it or not. The book ends with the total transfiguration of the entire cosmos, through the revelation of the kingdom of God and the city of God. This incidentally is what we are praying for in the Lord's Prayer when we pray 'Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven'. The reading today is taken from Chapter 5 in the Apocalypse, well before



the consummation of all things as envisaged in the last pages of the book. It sees all living things as configured to Jesus Christ and worshipping Him as their creator. This is echoed elsewhere in the New Testament. In the first chapter of the gospel of John, the apostle tells us of Jesus... 'through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made'. St Paul writes in Romans 11: 36 'For of him, and through Him, and to Him are all things'. In Colossians 1: 16 the apostle says of Jesus, 'For in him all things were created; things in heaven or on earth, visible and invisible. All things have been created through him and for him. The same theme marks the end of the eucharistic prayer in the Roman missal, when the priest says 'Through him, and with Him and in Him' which solicits the great Amen. When we say all things find their true end in the worship of Jesus their creator, we mean things that we can see and those which we can't see. To God all things are visible, but not to us. In the Apocalypse, St John is granted a share in that vision...that which is invisible to the naked eye...the worship of heaven by the invisible creation. What is interesting is that the angels gather around not just Jesus and the elders but around the four animals, which in the Apocalypse represent the whole of the natural world. The four animals, perhaps because the animal world existed before humanity, are mentioned even before the elders, the representatives of the Church. If this doesn't broaden our horizon ecologically then consider what St John next sees. He hears 'all living things in creation...everything that lives in the air, and on the ground, and under the ground, and in the sea' cry out in praise. Clearly the natural world freely accepts God as their creator, whereas mankind does not. That should blow our minds if not our ear drums. Weak is the worship of my heart? Fr Julian


