Gospel: John 17: 20-26

The Lord is king, most high above all the earth.

This year we shall be celebrating 70 years since the queen's accession. We talk of her ascending the throne, which means more than just ascending the steps to the coronation chair. This ascending or accession marked a real change in status for the queen, from being the heir apparent to becoming the monarch. Such a change necessitated a coronation so that she could be acclaimed visibly as the rightful occupant, and vested with the dignity of the office. I'm writing this on Ascension Day when we celebrate Jesus' ascending to his Father in heaven. Jesus' ascension is different from



an earthly monarch's ascension to the throne. Jesus doesn't assume a position which he had not already held. He returns to the glory which was always his by right, which earthly monarchs can only palely imitate and never attain. His ascension starts with the cross and his true kingship is proclaimed in a coronation of thorns and the outpouring of divine love. The night before he dies he asks his Father to restore him to the glory which he had before the foundation of the world. As Judas leaves to betray him, Jesus declares that 'now is the son of man glorified'. Jesus' ascension doesn't alter the status which he has had from eternity and which the cross has now universally revealed. He is always King of Kings so he doesn't need to assume an office which he hadn't previously possessed. He has no need to be vested with sceptre or orb as all authority, might, majesty, dominion and power belong to him. His kingship is not limited territorially and it has no bounds. No human could crown him. He crowns others. We talk of the coronation of our Lady, and pictures of Jesus crowning her abound in mediaeval art, though not always with the crown of stars with which the Apocalypse depicts her. This is the also the last of the glorious mysteries of the Rosary. Traditionally this mystery was known as the triumph of the saints, and in a real sense the coronation of our Lady foretastes the coronation of all those who triumph through Christ against sin, death and the devil. By virtue of our baptism all the baptised have the dignity of royalty but alas many will lose their crowns and betray their destiny. 'Hold on to what you have, so that no one will take your crown', the Lord says to the Church at Philadelphia. Our true royalty is tested by our allegiance to the King of Kings. In St John's vision of the throne room of heaven, the elders cast their crowns down before the one who wears many crowns. In her seventieth year of accession what a wonderful gesture it would be if Her Majesty, our dutiful monarch offered her crown, like some of her royal forebears, to the throne of heaven.....and where better than Walsingham.
